

Brownsville has let it be known that after a \$2,000, 000 tomato crop was harvested and sold another \$1,000,-000 crop will be harvested later aong in the season if weather and market conditions remain favorabe. Ripe tomatoes are being canned or turned into catsup, tomato paste and other forms of processed tomatoes at eight packing plants throughout the Magic Valley. Plants are run-Airg 16 hours a day and employing approximately 1000 persons. Payrolls will run close to \$50,000 a month and the output on the present scale of production, according to Brownsville canners and shippers, is about 10 carloads






