Smithsonian Expert Seeking Specimens
HAGERMAN, Idaho.—Hoping to unearth specimens that will supply the missing link in the fossil history of horses, a research expedition headed by Dr. C. L. Gazin, assistant curator of vertebrate paleontology of the Smithsonian Institution, has established camp on the Snake river near here.

Previous expeditions, headed by the late Dr. J. W. Gidley, found valuable bone species in the same region during the summers of 1928 to 1931. Bones of prehistoric horses were found which were declared to be different from any found elsewhere.

Dr. Gazin is accompanied by G. F. Sternberg, field vertebrate paleontologist of the Fort Hayes State college of Kansas, and G. B. Pearce, Sternberg's assistant.
