

### Tasmanian Beans Now Growing In **Eastland County**

L. V. Ford of Olden is raising the first Tasmanian beans to be grown in Texas, according to all advice now available. More than a year ago, he received the seed from the American Consul in Hobart, Australia, for a trial growth in the climate of Texas.

These seeds were planted the 6th of May, this year and in the first 30 days the vines showed a remarkable growth. A number of the beans on these vines now measure two and a half to four feet in length.

In Tasmania, these beans constitute the principal food stuff. They grow to an average of from four to six feet in length there. The bean is sliced crosswise in sections about half an inch thick, which are rolled in batter or meal and fried in the manner in which egg plant or summer squash are cooked. In fact, the flavor is quite imilar to that of egg plant.

The beans are highly nutririous and one bean will serve a number


