#### STALIN GIVES US CLEAR VIEW OF NEW DEAL

Josef Stalin's remarks about the predestined failure of the New Deal make interesting reading-not because Mr. Stalin's opinion of Mr. Roosevelt matters particularly, but because his statement forms a sort of looking-glass in I which we can get a new slant on the American recovery

For, by stating the Communist position so clearly and flatly, the Russian leader simply throws our own position into greater relief. By making a blunt declaration of things we do not believe, he helps us see what we really do be-

The essence of his theory is that the New Deal-or any other effort to improve conditions upon the capitalist foundation-must fail, in the very nature of things.

Unemployment is inherent in modern capitalist society. The ill against which workers protest cannot be cured without putting society on a new foundation.

The division of human beings into exploiters and exploited is fundamental, and the only possible solution is to give the exploited complete control.

It would be hard to find one paragraph which expressed more precisely the exact opposite of the sentiment which animates the New Deal.



The Russian leader's remarks remind us that we are making a great fight to prove that the traditional American way of life can be preserved. That is the real stake at issue in the recovery program.


