# Let's Choose Our Leaders Wisely... Carefully Investigate!

Politicians (especially Jack Kennedy) have and are forcing into an awkward position the following: unemployment, education and welfare.

Why we call the following FACTS to your attention:

**UNEMPLOYMENT**— We will never eliminate unemployment entirely. Some persons will always be ill, changing jobs, trying to find work that completely satisfies them or just entering the labor force and not yet employed because they're short on experience or skill.

Unemployment is at least partly a matter of definition. Some of those counted as unemployed in this country would not be called unemployed if we used the British definition of unemployment, for instance.

Of our total labor force today, (5) five percent are unemployed by our federal statistical definition, but only (3) 3 percent of the married male workers are without work.

Over the prosperous years (of the last 50 years) unemployment has averaged (4) four per cent of the labor force. Most of the unemployment today is among very young people or the unskilled.

**EDUCATION**— Jack Kennedy sees the education problem in quantitative terms — not enough schools, not enough teachers, not enough equipment. (Kennedy's solution is to spend more money—federal government contribution.)

I must agree with Barry Goldwater let's get concerned with QUALITY: How good are the schools we have? Let's raise standards. Let's not be so concerned with HOW a subject is taught, but with much more on WHAT is taught.

We have forgotten for WHOM education is intended. The function of our schools is not to educate, to elevate, society; but rather to educate INDIVIDUALS and to equip them with the knowledge that will enable them to take care of society's needs. We have forgotten that a society progresses only to the extent that it produces leaders that are capable of guiding and inspiring progress. And we cannot depend on such leaders unless our standards of education are geared to excellence instead of mediocrity. We must place full rein to individual talents, and we must encourage our schools to enforce the academic disciplines, to put preponderant emphasis on English, mathematics, history, literature, foreign languages and the natural sciences. School is a place to train the mind.

In our attempt to make education "fun," we have neglected the academic disciplines that develop sound minds and are conducive to sound characters.

In our desire to make sure that our children learn to "adjust to their environment, we have given insufficient opportunity to acquire the knowledge that will enable them to master their environment.

Our recourse to the education problem is with the local public school board, the private school, the individual citizen — AS FAR AWAY FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AS ONE CAN POSSIBLY GET.

FEDERAL INTERVENTION IN EDUCATION IS UNCONSTITUTIONAL AND MUST BE REGARDED AS ILLEGAL until such time as the Constitution is amended.

**WELFARE**— Kennedy and our Liberalist neighbors pose these questions. Have you no concern for people who are out of work? For sick people who lack medical care? For children in overcrowded schools? Are you concerned by the problems of the aged and the disabled? Are you against human welfare?

The answer to all of these questions is, of course, NO. But a simple "no" is not enough. First of all, the BIBLE tells us to take care of our own. (We as individuals are under this obligation).

I contend there is a vast difference between being concerned with these problems and believing that the federal government is the proper agent for their solution.

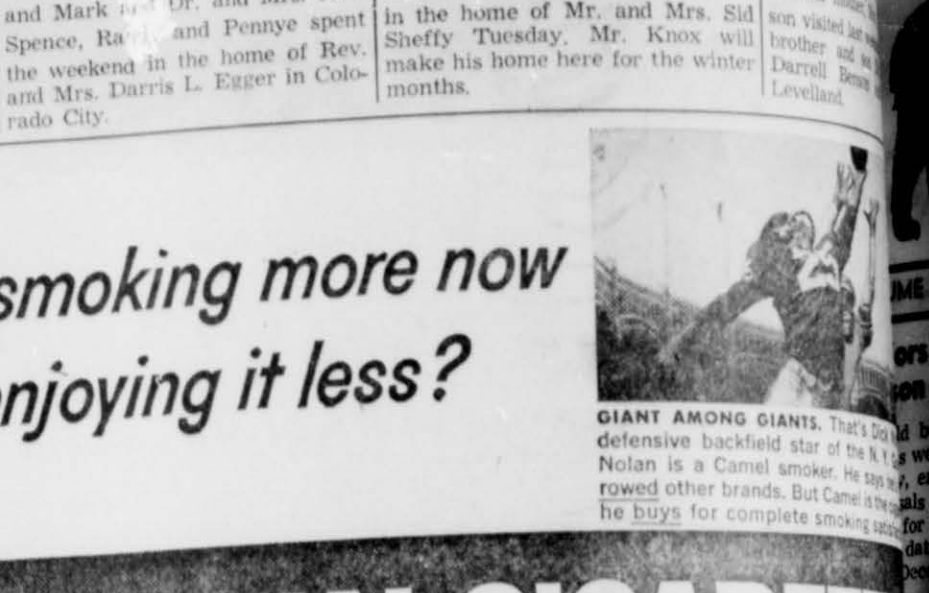

## Cotton Test Results Cited

by James Valliant and Douglas Owens

Irrigation tests conducted on cotton at the High Plains Research Foundation in 1959 indicate best results came from the preplant plus peak bloom irrigation method. This irrigation method was used with three different fertilizer treatments, as were all irrigation methods. Net returns from this irrigation method ranged from \$161 to \$31 per acre. In this same irriga-

tion method, the pounds of lint per acre-inch of water ranged from 85.3 to 94.3 pounds per acre. This irrigation method with preplant only produced more lint per acre-inch applied, but less net returns.

On the basis of this data, it appears as if the best fertilizer with the preplant plus peak bloom irrigation method was 0-40-0 during 1959, that is, no nitrogen, 40 pounds of phosphorus and no potassium. It is also believed that the phosphorus had little effect on growth.

These results indicate that time of application, not total amount applied, controls returns from irrigated cotton. Cotton irrigated a total of 21.5 inches and 17.2 inches re-

turned less income than the 8.6 inches applied in the preplant plus peak bloom method.

Irrigation efficiency is one of the answers to the problems of irrigated cotton. This is easily seen from the above results. With less water, less labor, and less pumping costs, a more profitable cotton crop can be grown. Time of irrigation and fertility level are two of the controlling factors in irrigated cotton.

This experiment will have to be conducted over a period of several years before definite conclusions can be made regarding the recommended irrigation methods and fertility levels for most efficient cotton production.

Tests made on irrigated cotton on the High Plains Research Foundation in 1958 indicated cotton will respond to fertilizer proportional to the amount of available moisture, similar tests conducted during 1959 confirmed this finding.

The value of water is increasing each year because of a declining water table. As the water table drops, the cost of pumping increases. Results from the 1958 irrigation test on the High Plains Research Foundation showed the value of an acre-foot of water to be \$85.94. This figure was obtained by subtracting the net returns of dryland cotton, \$105.23, from the most efficient irrigation system, which consisted of one acre-foot of water applied. The gross return from this irrigated, non-fertilizer was \$197.17. The pumping cost at \$6.00 per acre-foot was subtracted giving a net return of \$191.17. This was the procedure used in deriving the \$85.94. This figure increased when fertilizer was used. No water values were computed in 1959 because no dryland plots were planted.

Because of a declining water table, efficient irrigation practices are a must for the High Plains. Since the Ogallala formation is a perched basin, it will receive no outside water to replenish the diminishing supply. This is even more reason to conserve and efficiently use water.

This test, begun in 1958, is being conducted over a period of several years to determine the optimum time or times to irrigate cotton. Seven irrigation methods were used in the test. These varied from preplant irrigation only to preplant plus four additional irrigations. To allow for an estimated 85% irrigation efficiency, 4.3 inches of water was applied at each irrigation. All water applied was measured with an eight-inch flow meter. The time of irrigation was dependent upon the stage of growth. A severe hail storm on June 22 delayed the crop for an estimated four to five weeks. Rain during the growing season amounted to 21 inches.

Acid delinted Gregg cotton was planted on April 29 at the rate of 20 pounds per acre. Plots were 8 rows wide (40 inch row width) and 100 feet long. Three different fertilizer treatments were used on the cotton in each irrigation method.

A uniform application of 40 pounds of phosphoric acid was made on all plots. Nitrogen was applied at three different rates — 0, 65, and 130 pounds — in the form of anhydrous ammonia. Both the nitrogen and the phosphate were sidedressed on June 18 when the cotton was ready to start squaring. On December 7, the two interior rows of each plot were machine stripped with a tractor mounted stripper. Samples were taken from each plot for yield, grade, staple, and micronaire determinations.

Boll counts were made on November 23, 24, and 25 after a killing freeze on October 28, and the bolls per plant, open bolls per plant and percent of open bolls of the total bolls were determined. These counts were made on two 10-foot strips of row in each plot.

Irrigation method 6 consisting of preplant, 1st bloom, midbloom, August 20, September 5, produced more pounds per acre in two out of the three fertilizer treatments, but the ginning percent in all three fertilizer treatments was the lowest.

One of the most important factors in irrigated cotton is the moisture returned from water applied. Therefore, pounds of lint per inch of water and net returns per inch of water are important. It was seen that preplant only and preplant plus peak bloom were the two most efficient methods in returns per acre-inch of water.

Another controlling factor in irrigated cotton is fertilizer returns. The 130-40-0 fertilizer treatment under irrigation method 7 produced the most pounds of lint per acre, but due to fertilizer costs, the 0-40-0 fertilizer treatments under irrigation method 7 gave the highest per acre net returns. It is believed that this is partially due to the damage caused by the hail on June 22. The main thing the cotton producer depends on is the total net returns.

The goal in irrigated cotton is not obtaining increased yields but obtaining increased returns. Again irrigation efficiency comes out as one of the answers to the problems of irrigated cotton.

It should be remembered that the data presented in this report were obtained in one year only, and that this experiment must be conducted over a period of several years before definite recommendations can be made regarding the most efficient irrigation methods and fertility levels in producing high quality cotton.

**SOCIALISM:** A theory of social reform, the main feature of which is to secure a reformation of society, with a more equal division of property and the fruits of labor, and common ownership.

**DEMOCRACY:** Government by the people. A form of government in which the power is lodged in the hands of the people collectively.

**A state or body politic, legislative, executive, and judicial power of which is in the hands of the people, either directly or through representatives, as in the various states in the union: Equality as regards political and legal rights: Collectively, the people, especially those qualified to exercise the right of suffrage.**

**RELIGION:** A system of rules of conduct and laws of action based upon the recognition of belief in, and reverence for a superhuman power of supreme authority. (See Deuteronomy 10:17)

**TWO** of the above words and definitions belong to the United States and to our people. Let us continue to live with and enjoy a life of Democracy with Religion. Let us not forsake our God or our country for the want of another dollar or the blasphemy of the gogue.
