

A. Ivy, 45, Birmingham, Ala. The plane was the Delta company's eight passenger ship ob ained new only two months ago. Guy Weldon, a farmer, said he was awakened by the roar of a plane's motor and got out of bed as the ship settled down 350 yards from his home and burst

flames. Other farmers of the neighborhood said the pilot dropped flares and was apparently forced to land. Examination revealed one motor had dropped off the ship and it was believed this forced the pilot to seek a landing. The motor had not been found.

Gov. Allred Opposed to Creation of U.S. Oil Commission

Gov. James V. Allred is a states rights democrat. He has never deserted "the gospel of the fathers." His record is known to all the people of Texas as a champion of the acred dogma passed on to the people who came after them by the framers of the federal constitution-defining where federal rights ended and states rights began. He is rock rooted in his opposition to the latest proposal to create the supervisory board. This is his terse message to iederal senators and representatives:

"I am opposed to setting up any board to tell us any artificial demand for oil. It would be an entering wedge for tederal control if the state did not abide by suggestion of the board. I am certainly unalterably opposed to putting such a board in the department of the interior. I have so Edvised our United States senators. There is no occasion for a new board in Washington-certainly not in the department of interior. I remember what happened before. On a committee of 15 states the biggest oil producer in the country had only one representative. One of the smallet : tates nad 'our.'

Harold L. Ickes is the secretary of the department of the interior. He is for federal control. He is a very able and a very honest man but he has insisted from the beginning that the federal government should regulate the production as well as the marketing of petroleum and natural gas wealth of the commonwealth of Texas and all other commonwealths which are producers of oil and gas. President Roosevelt ent a nessage to the congress asking for the legisative branch of the government to consent to the state compact to conserve oil and gas. Leading supporters of pending oil legislation volunteered the information the President also would like to see final action "on a oroad program which would include creation of a lederal petrofeum board.

Senator Elmer Thomas, democrat of Oklahoma, wno 's for federal oil control, speaking on the short nessage of the President, commented as collows:

"If that is all he wants, that is all he will get."

Now the state compact executed at Dallas Web. 16, 1935, which has been ratified by New Mexico, Kansas, Oklahoma, Illinois, Colorado and Texas is before the nationa lawmakers for consideration "or ratification or rejection." First, last and all the time the governor of Texas, speaking for thousands of Texas democrats, including members of the rail commission, has sounded a warning against the proposed legislation. This includes the proposal to create a federal oil supervisory board or "setting up any board to tell us any artificial demand for oi." His argument goes all the road: "It would be an entering wedge for federal control if the state did not abide by suggestion of the board.
