





Cranberry Refrigerator Cake for Six

Three and one-quarter cups raw cranberries, 1 1-4 cups water, 8 pitted dates, sliced, 5 figs, sliced, 1-3 cup chopped nuts, 2-3 cups sugar, 1 small spenge cake, 1-2 cup cream, whipped, grated rind 1 orange.

Cook cranberries in water slowly until skins burst. Mash them through a sieve. Return the

Finish with a layer of sponge cake. Place in refrigerator for at least 8 hours. Unmold on attractive dish. Garnish with whipped cream and grated orange rind.
