Maybe "trickling" would be a better word than "flooding," in view of the small number of people who know Esperanto. But it is a small straw added to the long list of evidence that ingenuity is not enough.

The world's desperate need today is not more tools, but more knowledge of how to use wisely the tools it has.

Record Rainfall Promises Bumper Wild Duck Crop

NEW YORK—It's truly been "great weather for ducks." Record July rains, which brought devastating floods to some sections of the country, proved a timely boon during a critical period in the great Canadian "duck factory."

As a result, the largest crop of wild ducks in recent years may be expected, according to the More Game Birds Foundation.

Over 80 per cent of the continent's ducks breed in Canada, the Foundation estimates. The bulk nest in sections of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta.

In southern parts of these provinces untold millions of ducklings have perished in past years when marshes went dry during July and August droughts. This July, however, the story is vastly different.

"According to a report from Ducks Unlimited (Canada), simple rains have visited the former Canadian drought region except in a narrow strip of country extending some 600 miles westward from Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, to the British Columbia border," the Foundation states.

"Precipitation has been timely and copious in all other sections and continuance of favorable weather conditions, coupled with waterfowl restoration work underway, should assure a very satisfactory crop of ducks in southern parts of the provinces this year," H. W. Cartwright, field naturalist of Ducks Unlimited (Canada), advises the Foundation.

Ducks Unlimited (Canada) is headed by a former factory worker, in charge of the colony's physical training campaign.

Yachtsmen To Compete Aug. 14 At Galveston

GALVESTON, Texas—Yachtsmen of the Gulf Coast will compete here August 14 in the third annual Galveston Island Regatta for the Galveston Island Bowl and other awards. The regatta will be run on a triangular course, approximately six miles to a leg, being laid out within full view of the Seawall Boulevard.

Beginning at 8 a. m., the field of more than 15 yachts, sail boats and auxiliary sail boats will round the 18-mile course twice, the finishers crossing the final line during the afternoon. The course is being arranged to call upon the maximum skill of the yachtsmen in handling their craft, and to give spectators on shore as full a view of the race as possible.

L. Walter Hendee, chairman, announced that entries may be made as late as Aug. 11. The sterling silver Galveston Island Bowl, award for first place, will become the property of the winner.

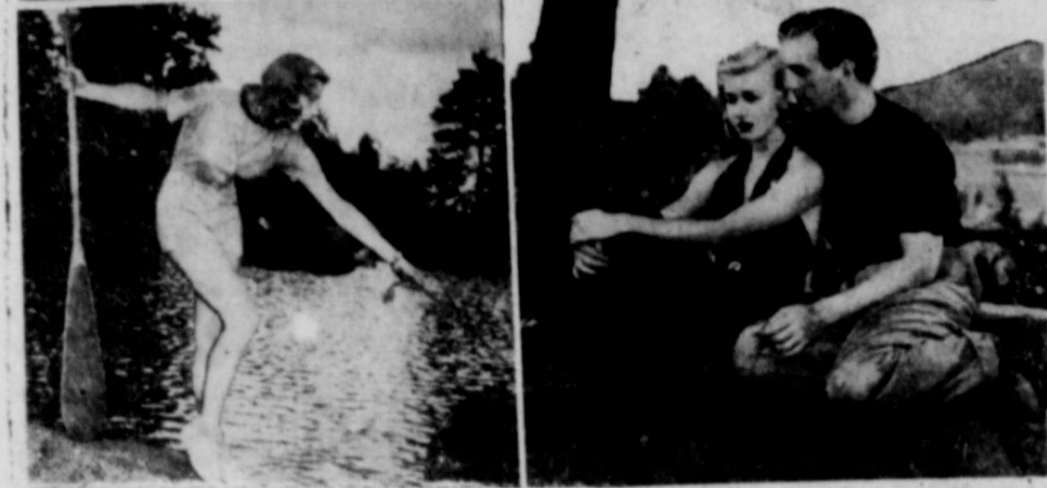
Area to Receive 14,600 WPA Jobs

FORT WORTH—Funds sufficient to employ 14,600 persons on Works Progress Administration projects in this territory during the month of August have been granted the Fort Worth office, it was reported today by Karl E. Wallace, administrative officer.

The August budget figures makes it possible to hire 1,500 additional persons in the counties administered from the Fort Worth office, provided that a sufficient number of suitable projects are sponsored by local governmental agencies, Wallace stated.

Urging that cities and counties take full advantage of the opportunity to furnish jobs for the unemployed, Wallace stated: "Budgets have been allotted on the basis of existing need and we hope that local officials will provide enough projects of integrity to supply jobs for all those who need them in the Fort Worth territory. Suffering among the unemployed, loss of community purchasing power, and loss of opportunity to obtain needed public improvements at a fraction of the normal cost will be the result of the failure to do so."
