Rhynes will continue living in Hart, where he owns his home, and he will name a chief deputy for the city of Dimmitt. He said he will discuss the appointment with his deputies before a chief deputy is selected.

Military spokesmen reiterated the Air Force's preference for site location in Nevada and Utah in their unveiling of the third Draft Environmental Impact Statement in Albuquerque.

They added, however, that deployment of the 200 missiles in Eastern New Mexico-West Texas remains a 'viable alternative.'

The MX Proposal calls for 200 missiles which will be shuffled between 4,600 shelters to keep their location

Air Force representatives, as well as representatives of HDR Sciences of Santa Barbara, Calif., the private firm contracted to prepare the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), addressed the problem of creating a boombust economy.

The HDR representative said they would provide incentives for construction workers to live in the metropolitan areas. "Or," he added. "we'll ask that they leave their families at home or have them live in metropolis

He also said some construction materials would be purchased in areas other than the deployment area, claiming that boom-bust is caused by increased spending in small communities.

Conservation

Field windbreaks may work for you

By BARNEY G. LEE Soil Conservation Service

Wind erosion affects every person in Castro County in one way or another.

Several methods of wind erosion control are available to Castro County producers. The method used by a land user is usually determined by his consideration of his needs. equipment, personal preference, and the needs of the land. One method may work for one producer, but may not necessarily be the method needed by his neighbor.

One method of wind erosion control is the use of field windbreaks.

Field windbreaks have taken a new look from the older types that were planted 20 to 30 years ago. The use of evergreen trees and shrubs has become more important in windbreak plantings. Proper windbreak management is essential for new planting as well as old ones.

The Soil Conservation Service assisted 36 producers last year with ordering windbreak trees to be planted in Castro County.

One of the major benefits of field windbreaks is the contribution to wind erosion control, but there are other benefits. Field windbreaks may make good habitat for some types of wildlife, they can help protect rural homes or machinery, and sometimes they are used for the protection of livestock. Properly planned and managed windbreaks can add to the aesthetic value of some farms.

Some other methods of wind erosion control are cropping systems, mulching, Crop residue. Management, strip cropping, field borders, and minimum tillage.

One or more of these methods should be used by the land users of Castro County. Each individual should decide on and use those methods which would work best for him and his land

Field windbreaks are not solution for every

producer, but they may be the solution for you. No matter what method or methods are chosen, now is the time to start planning ahead for control of wind erosion next



We in the library greet Christmas with some anxiety. Directly afterward all sort of reports and things need to be filled out. Then we have another year to handle with book prices going up, new regulations to regard and new salesmen to greet.

Those of you who picked books for Christmas gifts already know about the fine selection this year. This year of 1980 brought out many fine books, some best sellers, some unknown.

At the library 1980 was a fine year for children's books. The variety this year was fine, indeed. A noticable omission of integration and anti-racist literature left room for some very delightful books and ones which beginning readers would enjoy. Unfortunately, the sex books for children keep coming out and out, most of them very close to being kiddy-porn (Like the much taunted "Show Me" picture book). Yet, there are even bright spots here as sincere and knowledgeable authors write better ones.

Although this year's nonfiction had well advertised smut, like "Thy Neighbor's Wife" and "Men In Love," there were some real ringers. One which may one day have the most affect is a little known work by Martha Lear called "Heart Sounds." There were, of course, dozens of financial books and several titilating exposes' of famous people. Finally, the best development, in non-fiction was the Rockford College Institute, a conservative think-tank which monthly puts out well documented and well written essays on how American liberalism is changing us. Sometimes the acid remarks make the reader's teeth go on edge but the articles always have valid points.

Last but not unimportant, are the booming growths of electronic and computer technological gizmos which will soon influence all libraries to a great extent, even this one.

Social Security in Castro County By JANICE ULMER

If you are a disabled person, todays column will be of particular interest to you. Recent changes in the law are this month, December, 1980. These changes are intended to encourage people who receive social security or SSI disability payments to return to work

The changes are: If a person who is still disabled becomes unable to work within a year after benefits were stopped because of work, payments can be automatically reinstated. A new application is not necessary, but the person must notify social security. If a worker starts it will not apply. receiving social security benefits within five years

after they stopped and he or she had medicare before, medicare can begin immediately. The person will not have to serve another 24 month waiting period.

This is also effective for disabled widows and widowers and adults disabled before age 22 whose benefits start again within seven years.

Medicare coverage will also continue for an additional three years if benefits stop because the disabled person has returned to work. This provision applies only to persons who work in spite of the disabling condition. If the disability improves medically,

Impairment related work expenses can be deducted from a person's earnings in deciding whether he or she is able to do substantial gainful work. These expenses include medical devices and equipment, attendant care, and required drugs and

Disabled widows and widowers are now eligible for a trial work period which permits them to test their ability to work and still get benefits.

Social security will pay a reasonable charge for any medical reports it needs and requests.

Texas Sesquicentennial logo contest announced

The Texas Sesquicentennial of 1986, Texas' 150th birthday celebration, is on the way, and all Texans are invited to the party. Preparations for the birthday are being kicked off with a statewide contest to devise an official logo -- a simple and readily-identifiable symbol, or trademark, of the Texas Sesquicentennial.

The logo contest is one of the first activities of the Texas Sesquicentennial Commission. Created by the 66th legislature in 1979, the Commission is charged to "coordinate celebrations of the 150th anniversary of Texas' independence as a Republic and progress as a state." These celebrations will highlight the "historic, economic, cultural, environmental and social aspects of

During the planning stages of the Sesquicentennial, the Commission functions as a clearinghouse of information between state and local levels. The Commission will also work to encourage state, national, and international participation, to develop standards for sanctioning

local groups, and to plan for the creation of commemorative products, such as stamps and medallions.

The Commission publishes a special newsletter of the Sesquicentennial, the Texas National Dispatch. The Dispatch is a revival of a newspaper published in the early days of the Texas Republic at Washington-onthe-Brazos, and will be

available free of charge. The contest to develop a visual symbol, trademark, or logo, of the Sesquicentennial is open to all Texans. Contest rules are as follows: (1) Only one entry per person; (2) All are eligible except Commission members, staff, and their immediate families; (3) Designs must be submitted on one side of a plain, white 81/2" x 11 paper; (4) Entrants' names, addresses, phone numbers, and school affiliations (if any) are to be printed on the back; (5) All entries must be postmarked no later than San Jacinto Day, April 21, 1981 and the winner and runners-up will be announced on May 5,

1981 in Austin.

Winter is here, and with it comes foul weather. With the hope of reducing the number of inclement weather collisions, the Texas Tech University Traffic Safety Education Program reminds area motorists of the following winter driving guidelines:

Drive more slowly than usual. This will allow you to maintain better control of your vehicle.

2. When roads are slick. even slight adjustments to braking, steering and acceleration may cause exaggerated movement of your vehicle. ments and make them gradually. Avoid sudden starts and stops.

3. If skidding occurs, immediately remove your foot from the accelerator (or brake). At the same time, steer toward the direction your back wheels are moving. Overcorrection may reverse the skid. If this happens, steer the opposite direction. Continue in this manner until your vehicle is straightened out with respect to the roadway. DO NOT touch the accelerator or the brake until you regain control of the car.

4. Even after snow has melted, patches of ice may remain on the road, especially on bridges and overpasses. If you happen upon a patch of ice unexpectedly, immediately remove your foot from the accelerator and steer straight ahead. DO NOT touch the brake pedal. Your car will naturally tend to move in a

straight line. 5. At downgrades followed by a stoplight, do not start down the hill until you are sure you will have a green light at the bottom. Starting down the hill on a red light will necessitate trying to stop on the downgrade. As this is virtually impossible on icy roads, your vehicle may slide

If your car gets stuck, don't 'gun' your engine. This will only cause your wheels to dig further into the snow or ice. The best way to avoid getting stuck on winter roads is to avoid driving in patches of deep snow. If you should get stuck, however, DON'T PANIC. Place a flat piece of wood, cloth, or similar material in front of and slightly under the rear tires. Gently accelerate, and the car should gain traction and

7. Tire chains are a good Anticipate required adjust- idea on snow and ice, but be sure to remove them as soon as possible after the roads have cleared. If not removed promptly, tire chains may tear up tires and/or road surfaces.


THE STORY OF THE CHRISTMAS STOCKING


LEGAL HOLIDAY
