NEW YORK—A picture of Latin America as an Eldorado, with billion-dollar possibilities for the progressive American seeking new frontiers, is painted by William Liebow of Panama City, a former New Yorker who, in eight years, has become a leading business man

in the Republic of Panama. Liebow says that if U. S. commerce is to expand, it must be to the south, beyond the Rio Grande. According to Liebow, Latin Americans are ready and eager to learn to do things in the modern American way, but they need to be shown how. refused to pass the picket lines. Under the terms of the anti-picketing law, this was a clean-cut violation, for the law specifically provides that "... it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, association or organization to picket or patrol, or post pickets or patrols in or near the premises or property owned, occupied, controlled or used by an employer or employers unless there is an actual bona fide existing labor dispute between said employer or employers and his or their employees. It also shall be unlawful to boycott directly or indirectly any employer or the business of such employer not directly involved as a party in a labor dispute."

### Fogs Over London Are Fewer And Not So Heavy This Year

LONDON—London is losing its reputation as a foggy metropolis. For the second winter in succession there has been an unusual freedom from dense fog in the London area. Since Dec. 1 London has had fewer than half the normal number of foggy days. A vigorous air circulation over most of Britain has been responsible for this. A winter with little fog means better health. Statistics show that there is a sharp increase in respiratory troubles in a long spell of damp or foggy weather. The air near the ground in a thickly populated area may contain up to 500 per cent more poisonous carbon monoxide from motor exhausts during calm, foggy

weather than when there is a moderate breeze blowing and no fog. When a dense fog settles over London there may be suspended in the atmosphere from 200 to 300 tons of grime. Is there any place in Britain entirely free from fog? So far as is known, the least foggiest spots are at Stornoway, in the Outer Hebrides, and at Blackwood Point, Northwest Ireland, where fogs occur on the average of once a year.

### Picketing Curb Is Still Unchallenged In Oregon State

PORTLAND, Ore.—The state of Oregon's butchers and bakers and candlestick makers, angry because their shop windows had been broken and their trucks overturned, went to the polls last November and voted into existence one of the most restrictive picketing statutes in Pacific coast history. And now—with the "goons" jailed and labor racketeering crushed—they're doing their best to forget all about it. Since Jan. 1 only one case has been filed under the so-called "anti-picketing" law, and it was settled out of court quickly. Recently three Oregon ports—Coos Bay, Astoria, and the port of Portland—have been the scene

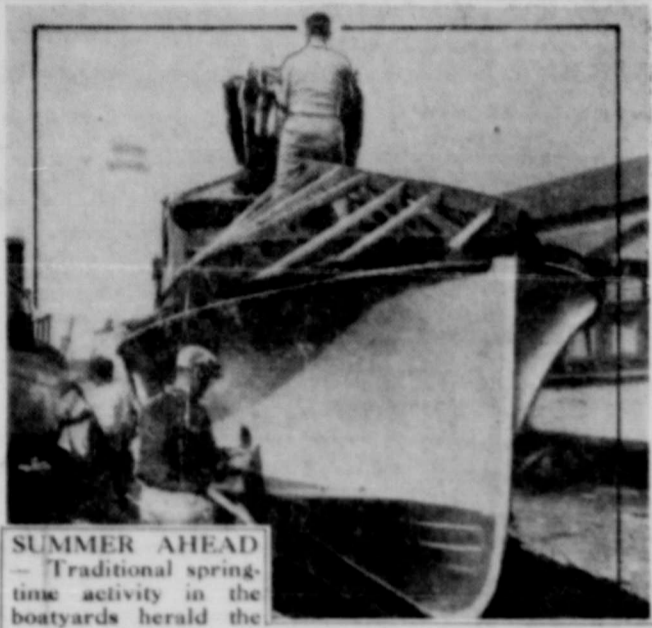

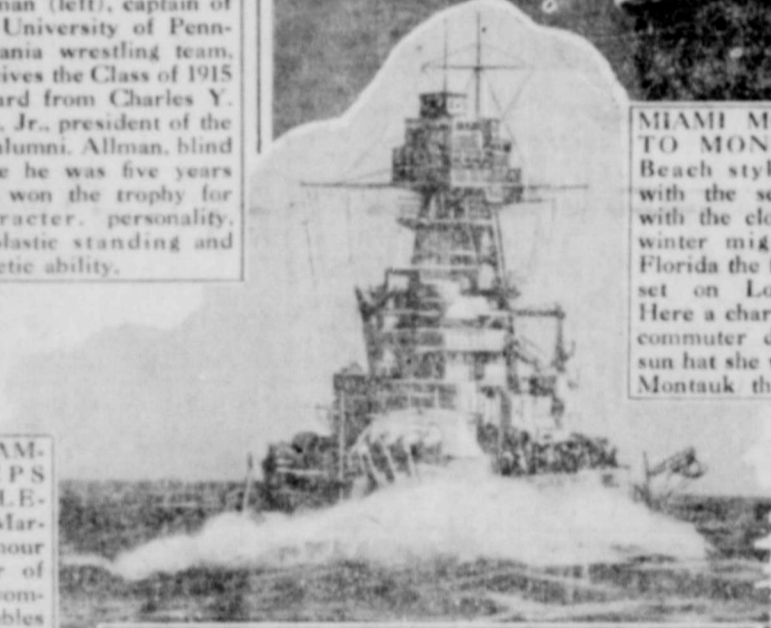

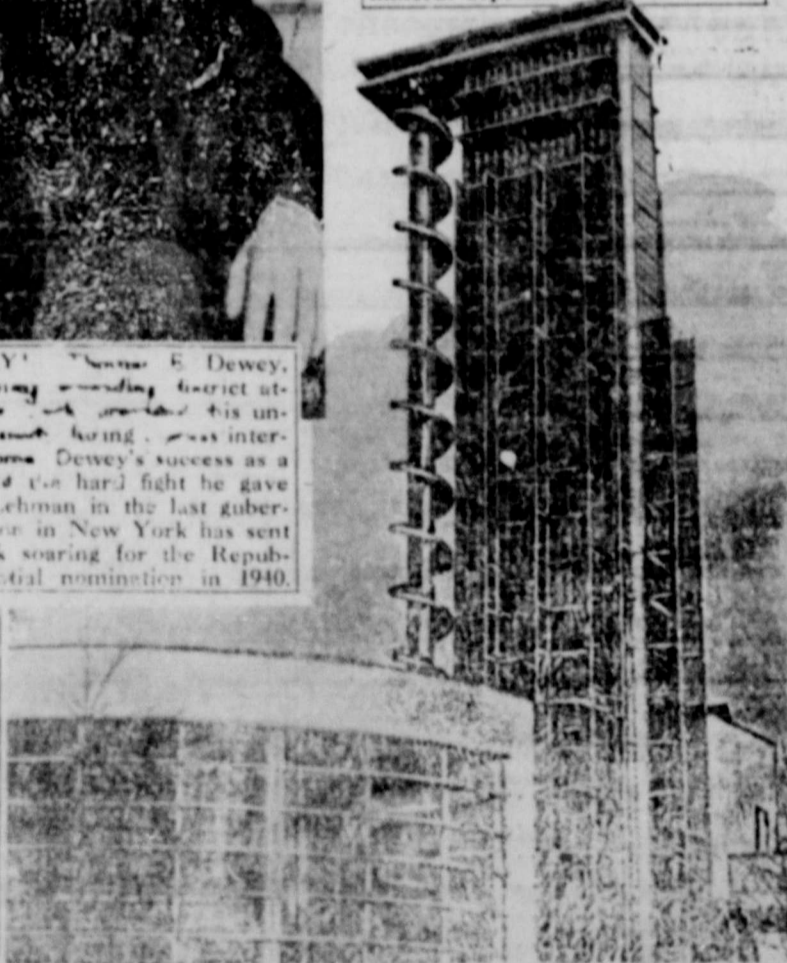

### Gravity Force Is Used To Increase Power of Motors

MIAMI, Fla.—W. F. Skinner proudly displays his latest invention, a device that multiplies power

large commercial cotton compressing company established warehouses nearby and several major oil companies have built adjacent tank farms.

Growth of the port is indicated by the amount of cotton handled during the past two seasons. Last Fall some 75,000 bales of cotton were shipped, the year before 30,000 bales were handled.

Out-going products include, beside cotton, the fruits and vegetables which the valley produces in great quantity, oil, broom corn, axes, scrap iron, linseed oil, fibre, and other products.

Incoming tonnage, which almost balances the outgoing products, include building materials, wire and steel products, machinery, hoes and bagging, fertilizer, sugar, furniture, etc.

Today the port is on the regular runs of seven steamship lines, two of which offer weekly service. Ships have called at the port from, or left for, harbors in 28 foreign countries.

Although tonnage handled has steadily increased, further gains are expected. Now more than 800,000 acres of the fertile valley are under irrigation and the completion of the huge irrigation project being financed by FWA in Wilcox County, Texas, will add still more to the valley's production capacity.

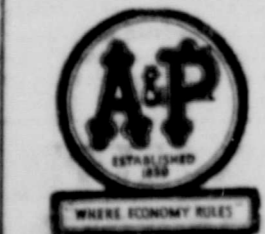
### Only Seaport In Middle Of Praire does good Business

BROWNSVILLE.—The nation's only port in the middle of a prairie, built at Brownsville, Texas, with the aid of Public Works Administration and the War Department, is doing fine. Two and a half years after completion 285 ships have called at the port and brought in or taken out more than 200,000 tons of manufactured goods and raw products.

Brownsville's port is situated on the flat prairie, 17 miles inland. A canal, 25 feet deep and at present being deepened to 29, leads up to a turning basin as large as three city blocks by four blocks. About the turning basin the special navigation district, which built the port, constructed warehouses, wharves, docks and other equipment with a Public Works Administration allotment of \$2,853,000.

The port was built to provide a means of obtaining cheap water transportation for the products of the rapidly developing Rio Grande Valley as well as ores and cotton produced in nearby Mexico.

Completion of the project was the signal for immediate industrial development at the port. A

horsepower motor," Skinner said. The "gravity power machine" consists of a steel framework containing four shafts controlled by eccentrics. On each shaft is an off-balanced weight which Skinner said was "about the secret of the whole thing."

He explained that the shafts, turning in the eccentrics, moved the weights in a circular motion at 60 revolutions a minute. Because the weights are off-balance, he said, they are always "falling," producing the multiplication of power.

The "falling," Skinner said, is more correctly a following of the weights to new centers of gravity passed by the changing positions of the shafts. The weights do not actually fall. The one-eighth horsepower electric motor, Skinner said, was used only for power to turn the eccentrics and the "gravity power machine" provided the power, in turn, to operate the ship.

**1,200 Per Cent Step Up**  
Skinner estimated the "gravity power machine" would increase the horsepower of a motor about 1,200 per cent. A one horsepower motor, he believed, with a perfected "gravity power machine" to multiply its output, could be made to drive a generator large enough to produce electricity for 3,500 persons. And the operating cost would be only about \$5 a month, he estimated.

The machine Skinner exhibited was the fifth he has built in the 14 years he has been "working up the idea."
