Fighting Fire With Fire

You can't fight a war against a totalitarian country without going totalitarian yourself-at least for the time

The British and French are finding that out. For seven years, Hitler's Germany has been making its people work longer and harder. The extra production, instead of going to the people to make life better, has been flung into pre-

Now the British and French, out to destroy such a system, find that in fighting it they have to do about the same thing.

As early as last November, John Maynard Keynes, British economist, put forth a plan now elaborated into a book, "How to Pay for the War." Details aside, Keynes proposes that each wage earner or family be allowed only a specific income, based on present normal subsistence needs. The rest of its income would be taken at the source and credited to him as savings.

After the war at such times as the government decided purchasing power was needed (that is, when the inevitable slump comes) these compulsory savings would be paid back to those who had earned, but not received them.

It will be readily seen that this is just about what is done in a war anyway, except that it is compulsory and systematic, whereas voluntary war savings (remember Liberty Bonds and Thrift Stamps) are hit-or-miss. Keynes argues that civilians must consume less, so that more can be put into the war effort. The way to do it is simply to see ing to Dr. George W. 

Oil Industry Is Hiring Chemists To Create Mud Pies

NEW YORK-Mud pies are the eternal spring-time bane of house-wives, and the eternal joy of the small boy. At least one American industry, however, takes these small boys when they grow up and become chemists and physic ists, and gives them full-time job just making mud pies. For to the three miles deep, is possible only because of drilling muds muds that do not one, but at least

Deep wells are bored with a drill on the end of a rigid pipe which is rotated. The pipe is hollow, and throughout the drilling of the well, drilling mud is forced down through the pipe, out through spaces in the drill, and back up to the surface outside the pipe, to be used over again.

This mud must hold back the gas pressures encountered in underground formations, so that the well doesn't blow out. Second, as it passes through the drill at the bottom of the hole, the mud must pick up the drill cuttings and hold them in suspension until they can be settled out on the surface. Finally, as the mud passes back up to the surface outside the pipe, it must plaster the sides of the hole with a thin, but impenetrable wall, so that the water used in drilling does not escape, so that underground water formations that may be penetrated by the drill on the way down do not enter the iole, and so that the walls of the hole don't cave in.

To do all of these jobs properly, the drilling mud must have many carefully-predetermined ties. Drilling mud looks like any other glutinous mixture of dirt and water, but its ingredients are as carefully measured and mixed as a doctor's prescription. Heavyweighing materials, like barito, are added to make the density, and weight, as great as possible, to hold back the extremely high pressures encountered underground. Clay muds are used to attain the viscosity needed to pick up and hold cuttings in suspensions and to plaster the sides of the hole. in difficult plastering jobs, large cuantities of colloidal materials,

like bentonite, are added. Proper mixture and maintenance of these properties in drilling muds are so important that oil companies must employ chemists and physicists at well-drilling locations as well as in their laboratories, scientists whose sole con cern is making industrial "mud
