Fighting Fire With Fire

You can't fight a war against a totalitarian country without going totalitarian yourself—at least for the time being.

The British and French are finding that out. For seven years, Hitler's Germany has been making its people work longer and harder. The extra production, instead of going to the people to make life better, has been flung into preparation for the war.

Now the British and French, out to destroy such a system, find that in fighting it they have to do about the same thing.

As early as last November, John Maynard Keynes, British economist, put forth a plan now elaborated into a book, "How to Pay for the War." Details aside, Keynes proposes that each wage earner or family be allowed only a specific income, based on present normal subsistence needs. The rest of its income would be taken at the source and credited to him as savings.

After the war at such times as the government decided purchasing power was needed (that is, when the inevitable slump comes) these compulsory savings would be paid back to those who had earned, but not received them.

It will be readily seen that this is just about what is done in a war anyway, except that it is compulsory and systematic, whereas voluntary war savings (remember Liberty Bonds and Thrift Stamps) are hit-or-miss. Keynes argues that civilians must consume less, so that more can be put into the war effort. The way to do it is simply to see to it that they don't have any money beyond actual need. Then, the war over, war production turns to civilian goods again, and the savings funds are paid back to people so they can buy them.

It won't be any harder to pay these savings back to everybody than to pay war debts back to those who now put up the money, Keynes argues, but if it is, you just have a whopping capital levy.

Whether Keynes' plan is adopted in full, total war must eventually mean something very like this. Free countries fighting totalitarianism have no choice but to become themselves totalitarian with the hope that after the war they will be able somehow to scramble back to a free way of life again.

Diabetes Takes A Heavy Toll In State Last Year

AUSTIN, Texas—Diabetes, the price America pays for indiscretions in living, took a toll of 720 lives in Texas last year, according to Dr. George W. Cox, State Health Officer.

each year in this country, diabetes, which was notably absent in the early pioneer days, is now taking a staggering number of lives," Doctor Cox said. "Up until the dirty mechanized age diabetes was not a health problem, but the disease became noticeable in direct ratio to the encroachment of luxury living, soft eating, soft habits, and general disregard for basic hygienic laws in our daily lives. Diabetes is nature's back-slap at coddling and pampering the body," Dr. pointed out. "Diabetes is a class disease. It attacks the indoor, sedentary type of person more often than a person whose work is vigorous or who combines work with sufficient exercise. Whatever the actual cause of the development of the disease may be, vocation or economic status are factors, for it is apparent that those persons who cannot indulge in luxurious living and whose occupation calls for physical effort are not frequently affected. "There would be fewer victims of ravishing diabetes," Doctor Cox added, "if those who are indulging in unnatural living would realize the folly of their ways. Persons of middle age and those beyond that age should exercise particular attention to avoiding diabetes. Simple living, annual physical examinations, and if already showing the results of indulgences, obtaining and abiding by the advice of the family physician, could drastically cut down the power of diabetes and its threat to an alarming proportion of adult America."

Iron Doorstep Was Once a Press Bed

MANCHESTER, Tenn. — The doorstep of J. E. Matthews' farm house at Summitville has a colorful story behind it, for the step is the bed of an old printing press that defied the Union army during the Civil War.

The press once held type forms for the True Patriot, which upheld the South's cause and denounced the Union in every edition after Fort Sumter was fired upon.

When the blue uniformed soldiers thundered into Manchester, their first objective was the enemy that had fired hundreds of verbal salvos at them.

They ripped the press to pieces and scattered its parts and type all over the streets of the town. The bed of the press lay in the streets for a year after the end of the war.

When J. B. Harrison, a refugee

from the Yankees, moved to Coffee county and built a log house, the flat piece of iron that once had been a part of the proud True Patriot became the rear of a fireplace. Several years later, Matthews bought the house, tore it down and erected a new one. The press became a doorstep—perhaps the most famous doorstep Tennessee. TRY Our Want-Ads

MODERN MENUS

SOYBEANS are the natural wonder food. When heated, they become a complete protein with all the elements needed for growth and repair of the body tissue. Gradually American housewives are learning to use them in their high-nutrition low-cost diets. A small booklet by N. A. Ferrari, M. D., published by Bruce Humphries, Inc., of Boston (for 35 cents) is just one of many valuable introductions to this vitally important food. Here are recipes from Dr. Ferrari's book.

CASSEROLE OF SOYBEANS
(Serves 4 to 6)
One-fourth cup diced salt pork, 2 cups chopped celery, 2 tablespoons chopped onion, 2 tablespoons chopped green pepper, 6 tablespoons flour, 2 cups milk, 1 tablespoon salt, 2 cups cooked soybeans, ground.
Brown the diced salt pork in a frying pan. Add the chopped celery, onion and green pepper and saute for about five minutes. Add flour and milk and cook until thickened. Pour thickened sauce over soybeans and bake slowly at 350° F. in casserole for 1 to 1½ hours.

PUREE OF SOYBEAN SOUP
(Serves 4 to 6)
One cup soybean milk, 1 table-

spoon finely chopped celery leaves, 2 tablespoons chopped onion, ¾ cup meat stock, 1 tablespoon flour, 2½ cups milk, 1 tablespoon butter, 1 teaspoon salt, ½ teaspoon pepper.

Cook the soybean pulp which has been put through a coarse sieve, with the celery, onion and meat stock. Add to a sauce which has been made of the other ingredients. Serve hot with crackers or toast.

SOYBEAN AND VEGETABLE SALAD
Blend cooked soybeans with any cold cooked vegetable or any raw vegetable such as carrots, celery, cauliflower, beets, peas and season with French dressing or mayonnaise.

That's what advanced students at the Texas State College for Women, Denton, have planned for the 1940 farm women of Texas. And not only planned, for they've actually purchased accessories and underwear, made inexpensive dresses, and secured necessary cosmetics, all within the slim \$25 budget. The work was done under the direction of Miss Gladys McGill, associate professor of the department of home economics.

More than a thousand home demonstration club women from North, Central, and East Texas viewed articles in this phenomenal wardrobe during the recent home demonstration women's short course held on the TSCW campus in cooperation with the Extension Service of A. & M. College.

In addition to modeling these attractive clothes which they had either made or purchased, the students told how many of the articles or piece goods had been purchased at end-of-the-season sales. The wardrobe included such diverse articles as cotton anklets for garden or household wear, a sunbonnet, galoshes, three pairs of work gloves, three house dresses, and lipstick from the five-and-ten-cent store.

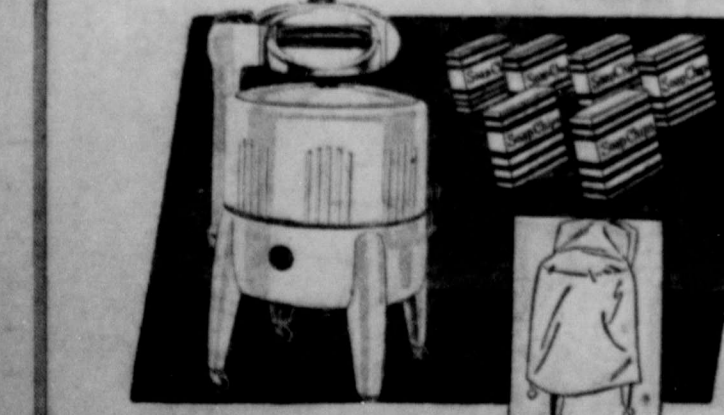

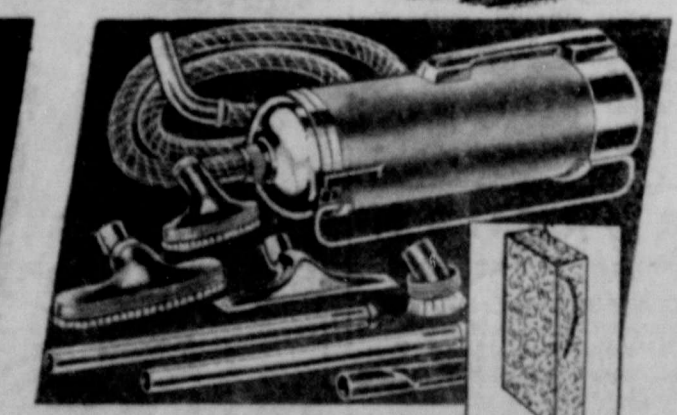
