MT. MORRIS, N. Y.—A "barter" cafeteria, inaugurated on a non-profit basis in the new \$310,000 Central School at Fillmore, is proving successful.

Miss Alberta Kleinfelder, home economics department instructor in charge of the new venture, reports the plan has found favor with students and is operating satisfactorily.

Under the new system, milk is sold at cost to the students, who pay for their lunches with vegetables, fruit and other farm products. Pupils receive credit at the regular market price for their products.

**Adult Education  
Serves a Purpose  
For Unemployed**

A man nearing middle age walked into the Ranger School of Adult Education several months ago, saying that a friend had told him that he might receive some help in learning touch typewriting. His was not an unusual story these days of a man who had lost his job and apparently was unable to secure new employment in the field where he had previously worked.

After walking the streets in the search, he had become thoroughly discouraged, broken in spirit, and almost without funds. Then it was that he met a former fellow-worker, who was attending the school of Adult Education and advised him to do likewise, saying that he could, without cost to himself, study touch typewriting there, which he evidently needed to complete his training for the kind of job he was seeking. Doubting a bit, but desperate

enough to try anything, he enrolled in the school, and after a few months of diligent work, had become quite proficient. Then, the door of opportunity opened to him for a good position with a large corporation, and a few days ago he very happily started his new work. The school had not only given him needed training, but had restored his morale through new hope and courage to go on to better things.

For two years this school, sponsored by the Ranger Public Schools, has served this vicinity. Competent teachers are available for courses in bookkeeping, typewriting, and shorthand. Classes

are arranged according to demand. Anyone interested in studying these subjects, either as beginners or for review work, may enroll at any time by calling at the school in the old Liberty Theater building, from four to seven o'clock, Mondays through Fridays.

The Education Section of WPA provides many such schools throughout the country. W. T. Francisco of Fort Worth is Field Supervisor of District No. 7 embracing 21 counties. Included in this is Eastland County, with schools at Eastland, Cisco and Ranger, under the general supervision of Dr. Lee Clark.

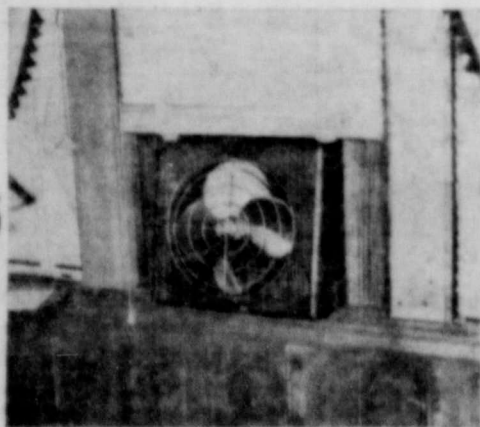
