Texas Failures Of Business Concerns Only 27 In January

AUSTIN, Tex. — Commercial failure struck 27 Texas business firms during February, compared to 37 in January and 18 in February a year ago, University of Texas Bureau of Business Research records indicated today.

Liabilities of the bankrupt firms aggregated \$351,000, or an average of \$13,000 per failure, compared to \$10,000 per failure in both January, 1941, and February, 1940.

Lack of Leaders In House At Opening Of Session Is Ended

AUSTIN, Tex. — One often-heard criticism of the House of Representatives when it met in January with 94 newcomers among its 150 members was that it lacked leadership. Subsequent events have proved that the criticism was unfounded, for the house has disposed of its work in efficient and orderly fashion compared to many previous sessions.

The controversial omnibus tax bill and the truckload bill each were passed with only one day of floor debate, and complaints against the work in committees have been fewer than usual although the docket is loaded with hotly-contested legislation.

Among house members who have taken the lead in legislation so far are Reps. Reese Turner of Cameron, Clinton Kersey of Bridgeport, and Price Daniel of

Liberty, who have taken turns "carrying the ball" on bills submitted by the governor.

Rep. G. C. Morris of Greenville, John Bell of Cuero, and James E. Taylor of Kerens took an active part in lining up support for the omnibus tax bill. On other matters, leaders have included Rep. W. O. Reed of Dallas, appropriations chairman, Lon E. Atup of Carthage, chairman of the contingent expense committee, sponsor of the scientific formula truckload bill, and expert on rules of procedure.

Reps. Houston McMurry of Henrietta and Gene McNamara of Waco have been in the front lines on bills affecting the petroleum industry, and Rep. W. R. Chambers of Brown County has been a leader in the House farm bloc.

The longest single day's session was 15 hours, which saw a \$25,000,000 omnibus tax bill passed finally. House members stopped neither for lunch nor dinner, and the oldest members could not recall a longer continuous meeting eve in the closing days of a session.

The following Monday brought what Rep. C. E. Nicholson of Fort Neches, dean of the House, termed the "biggest day's work we have ever done."

The House that day ordered engrossment of a bill for a permanent system of oil proration; held a public hearing on the governor's strike-control bill and sent it to Atty. Gen. Gerald C. Mann for a ruling; then argued and defeated the controversial \$26,820,000 social security appropriation bill submitted by O'Daniel.

Health Officer Urges Movies of Birth and Death of Residents

DALLAS, Texas—If recommendations of Dr. J. W. Bass, city health officer, become law, Dallas residents will "get into the movies" when they are born or when they die.

Dr. Bass recommended that birth and death certificates be transmitted by camera instead of by hand. Fire-proof film similar to movie rolls would be used.

This expedient would cost about \$50 a month compared to \$125 for copying the documents on the typewriter, the health officer estimated.

Belgium's Fate Rests With Britain Says Ex-Premier

Belgium's future depends on victory for Britain, Dr. Paul van Zeeland, ex-premier of Belgium, said in New Orleans on a visit to make a series of talks at Tulane university. What happens to Belgium "economically, politically and otherwise is bound to a British victory," he said.

The man who guided the Belgian government from 1935 to the end of 1937, advised that "right now the victory's the thing," as minister without portfolio from the government rejected his program, formed his own cabinet in 1935 at the request of Leopold III and early instituted the policy of increased military preparations.

Stating that the people were in "unanimous" support of his military program, the 47-year-old former banker declared that Belgium "increased the length of military

service, added more officers and increased the fortifications."

Dr. van Zeeland was in London when the war broke out, working as president of the Co-ordinating Foundation for Refugees which at that time was trying to find for Jewish refugees from Germany. In New York, his headquarters, at the time of the invasion of Belgium, he left immediately for his homeland only to arrive on the day of its capitulation.

"For me," he said, "it was a matter of dropping back, dropping back, until finally I was in France."

His wife and four children, who were living at Princeton, N. J., and making plans to return to Belgium when the blitzkrieg started, are still at Princeton. The families of both Dr. and Mrs. van Zeeland remain in Belgium.

With a Belgian company composed of students in the first World war, Dr. van Zeeland was awarded the Croix de Guerre for bravery in action. Belgium's armies and air force fight on beside the British and the other Allies, Czechoslovakia, Free France, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland and the sister nations of the Commonwealth.
