### Houston's Police Round Up Marble **Machine Evidence**

HOUSTON, Tex., May 10 .- Po e Chief Ray Ashworth, engaged an anti-gambling drive, said today that the grand jury would be handed evidence and information gained in a series of swift aids which netted 47 marble mahines with "pay-off records."

The raids were directed secretyesterday against 59 places exibiting marble tables. All the places had been visited for several weeks by Detectives D. T. Stodghall and Carl Shuptrine.

The officers had spent hours laying the machines, marking for iter identification those which 'paid off." Only 47 machines vere confiscated, 12 others having been removed before raiding officers arrived. 'I haven't decided just what

course we will take in prosecut-ing," Ashworth said, "We may file charges, or we may take the evidence directly to the grand

'In any case, I am not going to file on the exhibitors. The distributors-the ones who own the machines and keep them goingare the ones we are after. If we stop them, naturally, the exhibit will have to stop.

Raids on the marble table were made only 24 hours after secret band of 80 policemen, actng under direction of Ashworth, had raided 21 horse race betting shops, arresting 23 persons on felony gaming charges and 36 others on loitering charges.



### Minerals Have Played Big Part In Past 10 Years

AUSTIN, Texas Minerals, including oil and gas, within the would be closed Saturday at noon last decade have swung Texas from an agricultural to an indus-trial state. might be paid as late as 12:00 o'clock noon Monday, May 12th

While income from agriculture for 1940-tabulated by the University of Texas Bureau of Business Research, the state's chief statistical fact-finding agency on Texas agriculture, commerce and industry—is but slightly below that of 1929, the value of minerals has jumped 75 per cent.

This bureau—one of fou University research bureaus link ed under the Texas Commercia and Industrial Research Council to encourage and aid developmen of Texas resources-recently pre pared a chart revealing that the mineral industry last - year accounted for \$800,000,000 of th State's 1940 income, or about 40 per cent more than was derived from agriculture.

While about 90 per cent of the ninerals revenue comes from oil and gas, other minerals constitute \$50,000,000 industry -- "not hay," as one University research man put it.


