Lou Foote, well known flight instruction contractor, who also operates a United States Army flying school at Stamford, and flying schools at Dallas and Grand Prairie, will be the contractor who will be in charge of the flying

Jack Johnson will be chief pi-lot of the Lou Foote Flying Service, with Sam Barnett as associ ate pilot. They will instruct the 10 youths registered, giving them actual flight instruction. Ground classes in allied subjects will be conducted at the Ranger High

ELMIRA GLIDER TESTS JUNE 25

By HERBERT K. LEWIS pited Press Staff Correspondent ELMIRA, N. Y .- The 12th annual gliding and soaring contests will begin on Harris Hill near here June 28 with representatives of Germany-whose motorless aviation experts were principally responsible for establishing this enter of the sport-virtually barred from participating.

The Chemung County Board of Supervisors, which has jurisdiction over the Harris Hill area, recently banned use of any of the soaring facilities to aliens "of Axis inclinations" unless they have written approval of the War Department or Federal Bureau of Investiga tion. The ban was enacted to safeguard secrecy of any developments in soaring science which may be demonstrated before government officials here.

It was an expert from Germany, Dr. Wolfgang Klemperer, whose investigations brought attention to Harris Hill as a "perfect" starting point for motorless flights. During the first soaring meets here, Germans and Germanrained pilots predominated entry lists.

Congressman Martin Dies has done a service to the nation as rman of the Un-American Investigating committee of the House, to which position he can be re-elected next year. But he does not stand well with the President or other administrative and congressional leaders and would be a dead weight for Texas in the Senate of the United States. In any event, the time for the investigation of Un-American activities by a Congressional committee is rapidly passing. It is now a matter for the police.

Surveying the field of these four candidates one of whom will be elected Senator of the United States tomorrow-there can be but one conclusion as to the one who is best fitted, as we see it, for the multiple duties of that high office.

By training and experience, by association and habits, Lyndon Johnson of Johnson City, Texas, is the best man for Junior Senator from Texas.

The State of Texas is loyal to Franklin D. Roosevelt and his foreign policies. It can show that loyalty only by supporting the President's choice for U. S. Senator. 


