are more experienced in national affairs to elevate him to the U. S. Senate. He would do well to follow the course of others to the national capital, and might make a good Congressman or Governor.

Congressman Martin Dies has done a service to the nation as chairman of the Un-American Investigating committee of the House, to which position he can be re-elected next year. But he does not stand well with the President or other administrative and congressional leaders and would be a dead weight for Texas in the Senate of the United States. In any event, the time for the investigation of Un-American activities by a Congressional committee is rapidly passing. It is now a matter for the police.

Surveying the field of these four candidates—one of whom will be elected Senator of the United States tomorrow—there can be but one conclusion as to the one who is best fitted, as we see it, for the multiple duties of that high office.

By training and experience, by association and habits, Lyndon Johnson of Johnson City, Texas, is the best man for Junior Senator from Texas.

The State of Texas is loyal to Franklin D. Roosevelt and his foreign policies. It can show that loyalty only by supporting the President's choice for U. S. Senator. In doing so, the people of Texas surrender no initiative but simply say that they believe that unity is the best policy in the present emergency and that a unified Texas is backing Roosevelt's policies and sending him a man who will represent Texas in supporting those policies in the Senate of the United States.

Let us stop and think before we vote. Is it not true that Texas is indebted to the national administration for many honors and many favors? Is it not true that Lyndon Johnson is the President's choice for Senator? Is it not true that Texas has a right to expect its new Senator to be a man who will at once be able to speak with authority and backing? And is it not true that Congressman Lyndon Johnson is the type of young man that the people of Texas are accustomed to giving promotion?

Recent statewide polls show Johnson leading, after coming from fourth place in the race. Eastland county and Central Texas should join with the rest of Texas in saying "we approve" to the President next Saturday.

Eastland county cannot afford to waste its votes. By giving Lyndon Johnson a lead, the people of this county will prove their loyalty to the administration. To do less would seem ungrateful in the light of all that has been done in Washington for Eastland county.

Let us not be confused by the claims of the rival candidates. All who have observed the situation closely know that the trend for some time has been strongly toward Lyndon Johnson throughout Texas.

This is no time for a novice in statecraft to be elevated to the high position of United States Senator. We must have a man who, from the day he takes office, will be able to serve Texas fully and adequately.

Lyndon Johnson can so serve Texas, with dignity and honor. His friends and associates are the best men in public affairs in Washington and in Texas. He has a clear record and a clean reputation. He is not a fly-by-night or a flash-in-the-pan. He has no political scores to settle and no radical program of unattainable promises.

## Town Is Prepared For An Emergency Even To Blitzkrieg

GREENWICH, Conn.—At least one Connecticut town is prepared for any contingency up to and including an aerial blitzkrieg. The Greenwich Town Board of Estimate and Taxation has approved a \$3,885 appropriation for the purpose of 50 additional pistols; two transportable steel boats; 100 folding cots with mattresses, sheets, pillows, and other equipment.

Its emergency defense plan was worked out in cooperation with the Connecticut State Police. The pistols would be loaned out to members of the town's "militia," or to "any other group of special officers" in periods of serious emergency.

The two 14-foot steel boats are complete with trailers that can be attached to automobiles so the boats could be speeded to any lake or pond in town where they might be required. The 100 folding cots are to be stored away until needed. After a survey of available space, it was decided to set up these beds in the Y.M.C.A. and in schools in case of a shortage of beds in the hospital.

Town selectmen are not anticipating any immediate wartime use for this equipment but feel that it would be invaluable in event of any disaster, such as flood, hurricane, or fire.

### Blind Trainer Of Seeing Eye Dogs Becomes An Expert

LOS ANGELES—One of the most skilled trainers of "seeing eye" dogs for the blind is Otis Gathright, who is blind himself. Gathright uses a special technique and trains a dog in about four months. He has trained 10, and now is at work on Prince, a tawny German shepherd which he rescued from the pound as a pup. "Prince first had to learn that I was blind," said the trainer. "I would step on him purposely and

then have some one else avoid him as he lay down. Thus he soon caught on to my condition. "I use a chain with which to teach Prince to stay on my left side. Thus I can carry my white cane in my right hand and hold the dog with my left." Prince spurs the dog to learn his job. The dog learned that his life work is to look after the blind

master. Only about one in 50 German shepherds is fitted for the task, Gathright said. "Prince already can guide me around with only elementary training," he said. "He stops at all intersections—which is something many automobile drivers can't seem to do. When we cross a street he hurries me along to get out of the way of cars."

Gathright said it "takes a lot of courage" for a blind person to go out upon a city street at first. But with a white cane and a "seeing eye" dog the hazards vanish and the blind acquire an amazing self-confidence. We don't like restaurants where you can read the menu on the waiter's coat front.

 Low, as a 17-year old daughter who was graduated from high school just when her father was in the first phase of his military career.

### Crisis Such As Hitler Adores Is Due In The State

AUSTIN.—A crisis is something Hitler likes to stir up, and Texas is going to have one next month. As was the case in France and the Lowlands countries, where a panic-stricken people created a traffic jam which prevented defending troops from getting at the enemy, State Police director Homer Garrison, Jr., today expressed the fear that traffic in Texas during July may hamper internal defense efforts of law enforcement officers.  
 "Local, state and federal officers all have their hands full in waging a war against the underground armies which are attacking this nation," Garrison said. "Under the direction of J. Edgar Hoover and the FBI, Texas officers of every jurisdiction have rallied to the President's call for unity in law enforcement. The

officers in Texas today are working together as they never have worked before. And it is well that we should, for this war we are fighting becomes more crucial as each day brings German-American relations nearer the point of utter collapse.  
 "Our handful of Texas Rangers can not begin to handle the enormous volume of fifth column investigations, and for months the Highway Patrol has been quietly helping out with this work. The Patrol has become virtually an organization of shock troops, concentrating its efforts upon these investigations, and the control of traffic in the vicinities of military establishments and along the principal arteries of the state. There is a limit to the work a man can do, and these men cannot be called upon for more than the 12 to 18 hours a day they are working. They cannot be in two places at one time.  
 "With our forces in such a state of overtaxation, we now

face the prospect in July of the greatest traffic jam in Texas history.  
 Because people are working and have money to spend; because foreign travel has been limited; because traffic volume has been increased tremendously by defense workers and the presence in Texas of 12 per cent of the nation's armed forces; and because normal vacation travel will be greatly augmented by folks coming from everywhere to visit trainees, there's likely to be a wave of prosperity for the undertakers, hospitals and auto repair shops.  
 "The preservation of our American security demands that law enforcement efforts not be diverted from this defense job. Yet, on the other hand, neither can we stand by and see our people needlessly slaughtered in traffic.  
 "It may sound trite to declare that every Texan has a patriotic duty to help with the solution of this problem, but that is exactly

what I am doing. We who are charged with these responsibilities realize all too clearly their profound significance, and we realize equally as well that we alone cannot discharge them adequately.  
 "No real Texan would deliberately subvert our efforts to combat the fifth columnist or weaken our defense by contributing to the death or injury of any soldier, defense worker, or civilian. And these things will not be done deliberately, but carelessly, by show-offs and wily-nillys and good, solid, substantial citizens who just don't realize the part they are playing in the world's second greatest drama.  
 This individual responsibility must be brought home to all our people. I appeal to all Texans—and especially the press, radio and clergy—to help us with this gigantic problem."  
 Maybe bachelors and old maids just haven't the heart to fall in love.

### Nearly A Year To Complete A Letter Due To Conditions

AUSTIN, Tex.—University of Texas librarians had an indirect report on "conditions" in fallen France today.  
 The first half of what invasion has meant in the everyday life of Frenchmen came in a letter from the library's Paris agent concerning an order for books placed a year and a half ago.  
 The second half in Lyons, March 18, 1941. The letter part was very brief, very unrevealing, librarians said. The delay of almost a year in completing the letter went almost unaccounted for.  
 "Because of circumstances," the letter said, and said no more.
