## City-wide Garage Sale set for June 5

"We placed everything we took to Waco," said TSA sponsor and instructor Charles Cotter. "We probably had more chapter and individual high honors than about anybody.

"I thought we had an outstanding trip. As a group the kids conducted themselves very well.

"I'm just real pleased with how well DHS did, considering that we took the smallest group of kids in the past 25 to 28 years.

The chapter was awarded the Chapter Excellence Award for outstanding chapter of the year. Industrial Technology teach Charles Cotter was named TSA Advisor of the Year. Senior Mindy Maxwell was awarded a \$1,000 scholarship - the first ever won by a Panhandle student. Although it is only two seniors he's losing this year, Albracht will still feel the loss.



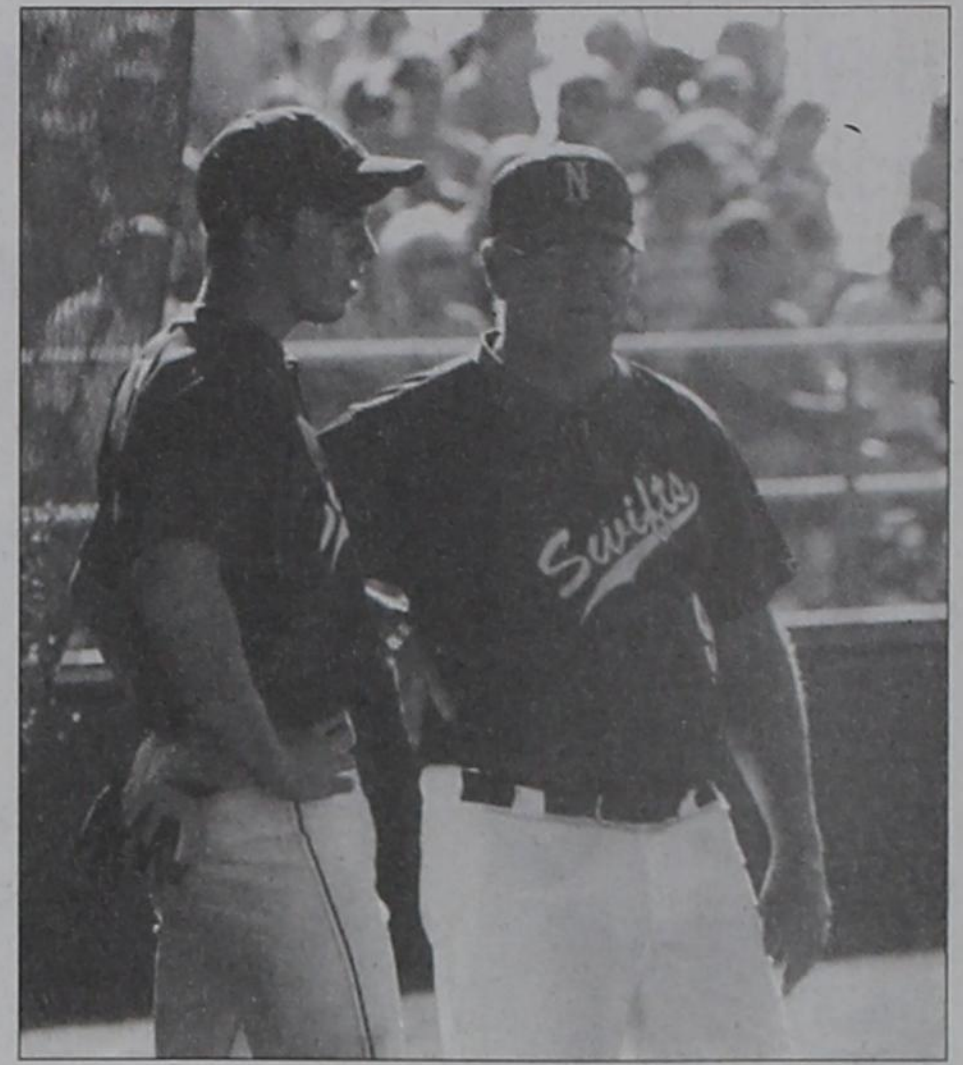
Dustin Schulte, playing catcher, talks with senior pitcher Brett Hoelting during the Nazareth game against Ralls in Floydada.

In the championship match against the defending state champions, Amina and Uthala Abdullah, the Nazareth duo jumped to a 4-2 first-set lead.

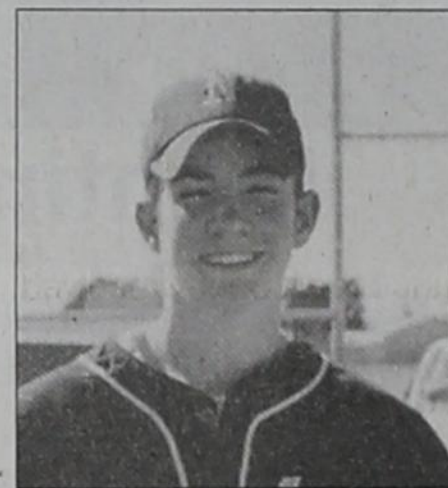

After the opening set, play

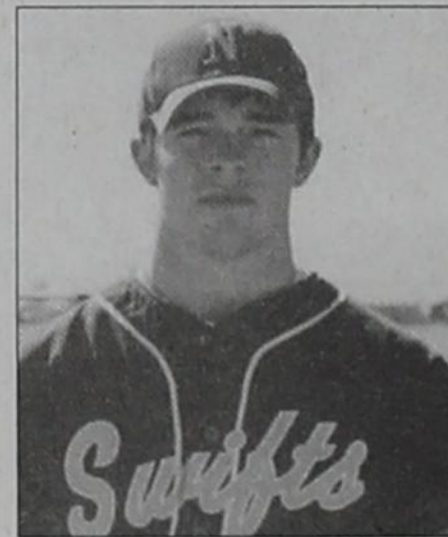

(I use one myself at home so I can sit in the living room and surf the web during commercials), however if they are not setup correctly they can be a huge vulnerability.

You see, that signal doesn't stop at the outside walls of your office or home.

Nope, it can easily travel

several hundred feet where your neighbors or someone driving down the street with a laptop can easily pick it up and start using your internet for free.

So what is the big risk in that?

None, after all they probably aren't using enough of your total bandwidth to slow your surfing down.

However, if you share files between your computers and don't have a strong password setup to log in from one computer to the others, then anyone could potentially log in to your computer and either copy or delete those shared files.

It's no different than someone walking into your home or office and plugging their laptop directly into your network.

What's worse, all routers by default broadcast their name to let anyone nearby know that they are available for use.

If you don't turn of the SSID broadcast feature and enable encryption on your wireless router then you are welcoming anyone within broadcast range to share your internet and your files.
