FOUR BIG SHOWS PLANNED  
FOR SATURDAY AND MONDAY  
IN AFTERNOON AND NIGHT

HOMECOMING CELEBRATION WILL BE STAGED SUNDAY AS PART OF BIG THREE-DAY EVENT STARTING SATURDAY, AUG. 30 AND ENDING MONDAY, SEPT. 1.

Ranger's biggest rodeo to date... the fourth annual rodeo... will be staged Saturday, August 30 and Monday, September 1, with a homecoming celebration planned for Sunday, Aug. 31.

A contract has been let with George Glascock of Cresson, well-known throughout this part of the country for his rodeos, to furnish the stock and be general manager of the rodeo at the four big shows, Saturday afternoon and night and Monday afternoon and night.

Special attractions have been provided by Glascock, including some that have never before been presented in Ranger, and seldom at a rodeo in this part of the state.

Regular events will include calf roping, with some of the fastest ropers in the state participating. A large number of entries is expected in this popular event, for which a \$50 purse has been added. In previous years ropers from as far away as Oklahoma and New Mexico have taken part in the Ranger Rodeo, and many of them are expected back this year. An entrance fee of \$5 will be charged all ropers.

Bronc riding, which comes in for a big play at the Ranger Rodeo, will again be one of the regular contests. An entrance fee of \$5.00 will be charged and \$100 is being added to the purse to make it worthwhile for all good riders to enter.

Bushwhacker riding will also be staged, with the entrance fee and added purse being the same as in the bronc riding contests.

In addition there will be wild cow milking contests at each show and bareback bronc riding contests will also be staged.

Added attractions at the rodeo this year will include the regular sponsors' contest, with a \$100 hand made saddle as first prize, a pair of \$35 cowboy boots as second prize, and other valuable prizes being offered. The contestants must be able to ride to compete for these valuable prizes, and in case there is a large number of entries, preliminary contests may be staged before the rodeo starts to eliminate those unable to compete in fast company.

One of the most popular attractions is expected to be a well known bull fighting clown, who will be at each performance and who will fill in the time between events so there will be something going on all the time. The clown alone promises to be worth the small admission price which is charged for the Ranger shows.

Square dancing on horseback will be presented at the Ranger Rodeo this year for the first time. A team has been secured which has had much experience in this fairly new exhibition feature.

Sunday afternoon, at the huge Ranger Recreation Building auditorium, a special singing will be staged, with such famous quartets as the Stamps Quartet and the Bewley Chuck Wagon Gang being featured. Sunday evening joint services will be held at the Ranger High School football stadium.

### Baseball To Aid Defense Stamps

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Professional baseball will make its contribution to National Defense with special exercises in all ball parks of both major and minor leagues on Thursday, August 28, Secretary Morgenthau announced today.

Arrangements for this nationwide Baseball Defense Bond Day program were made by the Treasury Department with the cooperation of baseball officials. Ceremonies will be held in 135 minor league parks and at the seven times scheduled for that day in games scheduled for that day in arrangements call for participation by mayors, postmasters, officials of the Defense Savings Staff, American Legion bands and bugle and drum corps, and distribution of literature by the Boy Scouts of America.

A special feature of the observance in each park will be a brief recording to be played over public address systems. This includes selection from "Any Bonds Today?" the Defense Savings Program theme song which Irving Berlin wrote for the Treasury Department, and a short talk by the Secretary of the Treasury. Secretary Morgenthau will be introduced on the recording by Commissioner Landis.

### War Children Of Britain Become Really American

NEW YORK.—British children who were taken from the war zone and brought to America more than a year ago are losing their English and Scottish accents.

The British-American Ambulance Corps, which sponsors good will broadcasts between the children and their parents reports the youngsters are becoming American-minded.

For example, the change that has taken place in Jack and Jain McDonald is cited. They are the sons of a Claybank ship builder who arrived in this country about a year ago. Since then they have lived in Chattanooga, Tenn. On a recent broadcast they startled their father with slow southern drawls.

Asked whether he preferred cricket to baseball, Jack responded, "Ah don't know how to play cricket any moah."

Other instances are cited in which popular American slang has invaded the children's speech. "Everything's swell" or "O.K.," they tell their fathers and mothers. The traditional British reserve associated with young as well as old, seems to have disappeared.

### Cape Cod Men Are Staging Roundup To Get Blackfish

EASTHAM, Mass.—With a "Hi Ho, Silver" and a "Yippy-yi-yay" they're staging a fish roundup at Cape Cod Bay.

And the harvesting of blackfish is one of New England's most curious methods of commercial fishing. It is patterned after the western cattle roundups.

A fleet of fishermen in speedboats drive the schools of blackfish toward the shore. It's a gradual process before the fish, many weighing more than a ton, are worked into shallow water.

Once in the shallows the speedboat fleet roars toward the school and the fish, in trying to escape, beach themselves. Shore workers drag the catch to high land and cut out an oil sac.

DALLAS.—A cool \$500,000,000 came to Texas, all because the "little guy" got together with other "little guys."

Statistics on the total amount of money awarded to Texas firms in the national defense program change so rapidly as to be almost beyond compilation, but it passes easily the half-billion dollar mark.

A Chamber of Commerce official estimated that orders filled and contracts awarded Dallas firms in the last year—since Congress and the nation embarked on its production speed-up—probably would reach \$200,000,000. Houston has received at least a similar amount.

A plane factory at Fort Worth, a magnesium production plant at Texas City, a shell loading plant at Texarkana and awards to other Texas cities easily would account for another \$100,000,000. The state's total, if complete figures were available, conceivably could reach a billion or more.

And Texas' sharing in defense contracts has only begun.

Complaints are being filed from small manufacturers hiring 10 to 50 men that Administration officials in Washington were urging the "little man" to participate in the defense program but that his efforts to comply were blocked.

Chambers of Commerce were belaguered with complaints when gigantic eastern industries got all the big contracts. To help bring the government and the small manufacturer together, the chambers made surveys of southwestern plant facilities and made them available to Washington.

Then the Office of Production Management established district branches in Dallas, San Antonio, Houston and El Paso.

Clinics were held, brochures made available, and finally pools of manufacturers were formed.

The "pools" are organizations of manufacturers and small shop owners in cities and towns all over the state. Under the leadership of one of the group, surveys are made of the facilities available in the organization—the kinds of jobs that could be done, man-hours available, tool supplies and total floor space.

Then the pool is put on the government's "invitation to bid" list. When a contract is to be let, the pool makes its bid. The government, with the survey showing the pool's capacities, is able to determine whether the contract can readily be filled.

This cooperation of the little man has enabled Texas manufacturers to obtain government orders in instances where the same individuals—because singly they could not have presented a picture of their facilities of sub-letting of parts of orders they were not equipped to fill—would have been turned down.

A. J. Langford, district manager of the OPM branch here, said that 500 West Texas manufacturers had attended meetings he had organized on a recent trip. "Their interest shows the success we have been meeting in forming the pools," he said.

In Wichita Falls, Amarillo, Lubbock, Abilene, Waco, Pampa and Dallas pools are in operation. Others are being organized at Gladewater, Paris and Texarkana. Gradually the structure will be expanded to other cities of the state.

Langford pointed out an example of the pool's function. A North Texas radio shop owner was awarded a contract for radio range finders for the army signal corps. He sub-let contract to a cabinet shop to supply wood cases for the range finders, to a sheet

metal worker for sheet metal parts and did the electric wiring in his plant.

"Thus the pool, because its facilities were known, was able to obtain the contract which probably would not have been available to the individual," Langford said.

In another instance the prime contract holder sub-let more than 70 per cent of the government

order, doing only a small part himself.

"This probably is an unusual instance, but it illustrates the value of the pool," Langford said.

Additionally the OPM seeks to secure sub-contracting awards from Eastern firms.

"When a contract is awarded a big company like General Electric or Baldwin locomotive, we write

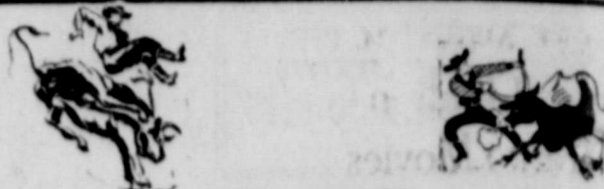
them outlining the work that can be done by Texas shops, and offer to facilitate any sub-contracting they may care to do," he said.

"Let me emphasize that we're still in what might be called an organizational stage. Most of the pools are just beginning to function. As the program develops Texas should share in the defense program and aid in the speed-up of production.

"We're still getting complaints from the small manufacturer, but the main problem, that of getting prime contracts which can be sub-let, is definitely on the road to solution," Langford concluded.

### Florida Children Get Into Movies On Defense Stamp

WASHINGTON, Florida children are now getting into the movies by showing a Defense Savings Stamp.

Beach, which operates 110 motion-picture theaters in that State, has developed a special children's matinee plan, with Defense Savings Stamps used for admission, the Treasury Department was informed last week by the theater chain. On August 9, when the plan was launched, more than 35,000 Florida children bought ten-cent Defense Savings Stamps from the post offices in the cities where the theatres were situated or in the theatre lobbies. ### Cow Unwittingly Is A Partner In Hot Check Plan

AUSTIN—Now there are two famous cows—Mrs. O'Leary's and Mr. Wright's. Everybody knows about Mrs. O'Leary's cow, and the lawyers and police officers of Texas are learning about Mr. Wright's. It was four years ago that Wright began selling his cow, along with a song and dance, and he's been selling it ever since.

Wright—his initials are C. R., but his friends call him Charley—always sells this cow to one C. A. Fox for \$42. Mr. Fox pays by check, typing everything but his scrawled signature, and usually notes on its face that the check is "For 1 cow". Usually, upon selling the cow again, Wright calls upon a lawyer in a medium-sized city, retains the lawyer to handle a suit against a railroad whose train allegedly has run into his truck, and gets the lawyer to endorse Fox's check so he can cash it. On two occasions Wright sought the professional services of a dentist. A Cleburne dentist gave him a \$30 set of false teeth and \$12 change for Fox's check. A Seguin dentist endorsed one of the checks after agreeing to work on Wright's teeth.

Fox's check always comes back marked "no account" and Wright is nowhere to be found. Wright's first known offense was in Mineral Wells in September, 1937. Subsequently he has cashed worthless checks in Cleburne, Laredo, Waco, Marlin, Cameron, Conroe, Kerrville and Seguin. Chief Joe S. Fletcher of the State Police Bureau of Identification believes many swindles perpetrated by Wright have never been reported. Wright is described as 55 years old, 150 to 160 pounds and about 5 feet 10 or 11 inches tall.

negotiated for years for the site, but resorted to condemnation proceedings two years ago when negotiations failed. Hearings in the suit are scheduled to begin soon at Placerville, the county seat of El Dorado county in which Marshall's mill was located. The move to acquire the site was started by Newton B. Drury, now director of the National Park Service, when he was connected with the state park commission. Only a stone monument now marks the spot where California's first gold was discovered. State acquisition will mean the site will be improved and tended by state park workers. An effort may be made to reconstruct the mill itself.

At the time the monument was constructed, parts of the mill were recovered and more remain in the river bed, according to Deputy Attorney General Cunningham, who has been handling the case for the state. The site has a history somewhat parallel to that of its first owner. The land was so torn by gold seekers in the early days that it was considered worthless for many years and at least once was sold for unpaid taxes.

Marshall himself made no gain from his discovery. He never made another strike and died penniless. However, modern mining methods have brought land into demand again. Until several months ago a dredging company was also

seeking possession of the site to resilt the once-golden soil with hydraulic equipment. The site is owned by Perley Monroe, a Negro janitor at the state capitol in Sacramento, who bought it ten years ago on speculation.

### Park At Site Of Gold Rush Is Up To State Courts

PLACERVILLE, Cal. — The state of California is preparing to

go to court to acquire title to the most famous spot in the state—the site of James Marshall's mill where gold was discovered.

It was in the trailrace of Marshall's mill at Coloma on the American river that flecks of gold were discovered in January, 1848. The discovery started the flood of gold seekers that reached its crest in 1849 and 1850. The state park commission has

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shows will be a regular feature in all the houses operated by State Theaters, and J. L. Newspapers and radio stations throughout Florida are cooperating in promoting the special children's matinees.

### Typhus Fever In State Shows Big Increase In Week

AUSTIN.—The prevalence of typhus fever in Texas during the past week was almost three hundred per cent higher than the 7-year median for the disease at this time of year, according to Dr. C. W. Cox, State Health Officer.

Whereas we could normally expect thirteen cases of typhus fever during the first week of August, actually thirty-eight cases were reported and the number continues to increase.

The rat is the animal host for the insect vector which spreads typhus, and since hot, dry weather favors the increase of fleas among the rat population, the possibilities of typhus transmission are thus increased.

Old World typhus fever had a high death rate, while the type here in Texas, sometimes called Brill's disease, has a much lower death rate. Typhus occurs most frequently among persons who work or live in rat-infested buildings. It was this fact that led to the discovery that rats are the carriers or transmitters of the disease. It appears that the rat suffers attacks of typhus fever and that the fleas harbored by the sick rat bite man, and thus human infection results.

Although typhus is not commonly fatal, it cannot be considered lightly. The intense headache, the high fever, and the great mental depression are its most commonplace features. In common

### Roads Rebuilt For Army Maneuvers

ALEXANDRIA, La.—Because the army likes to use the back roads, some of the little-used roads with sealickness, the patient's greatest fear is that he is not going to die. The illness generally lasts about two weeks.

The control of typhus fever is primarily dependent upon the extermination of rats. Trapping and poisoning are helpful in exterminating them, but the best results are obtained by starving them. Rat proofing of buildings where food is stored is the surest method of exterminating rats by starvation. The Department of Health and the U. S. Bureau of Agriculture will be glad to assist communities in their programs of exterminating this pest.

### Pop Goes Rivet And An Airplane Problem Is Solved

NEW YORK.—Airplane rivets which pop and spread out like popcorn when heat is applied!

These new explosive rivets represent one of the numerous innovations which the nation's aircraft manufacturers have had to resort in overcoming production problems and speeding turnouts.

The "popcorn" rivets came into being to do a specific job. In nearly all planes there are tight corners and angles in wing and fuselage construction into which it is difficult to place rivets. Ordinary riveting methods necessitate somebody holding a bucking block behind each rivet as it is

hammered and expanded into place. But there are corners so snug that the bucking block couldn't be introduced, so the aircraft manufacturers had to do something about it. The answer was the explosive rivet . . . now being used or tested by many manufacturers.

For example, at the Republic Aviation Corp., at Farmingdale, L. I., the explosive rivets are in daily use. The rivet has a hollow shank, into which a tiny charge of old-fashioned black gunpowder is inserted and sealed.

The rivet is placed in the hole drilled for it and a heated tool resembling an electric soldering iron is touched to its head. The powder charge explodes; the shank of the rivet is automatically flattened into place.

### Plenty Of Cotton Stocking Designs Are Now Available

COLLEGE STATION.—More than 150 different cotton stocking designs now are available to the hosiery industry as a result of investigation by the Beltsville, Md., research center. Three years ago Congress appropriated funds to the Department of Agriculture for investigating the use of cotton for women's hosiery.

According to Dora R. Barnes, specialist in clothing for the A. and M. College Extension Service, the designs vary from cotton web mesh for evening wear to plain knits in various weights for sport wear, and for around the house

and garden. Several are in production and more will be available.

They are produced on a new full-fashioned knitting machine and undergo severe laboratory and "field" tests for wearability and appearance. Surveys made in 1940 show that 89 per cent of the 16,000 full-fashioned knitted socks in the United States are made of white cotton as well as a white only 47 per cent can be nylon yarn. Last year, American women bought more than 43,000 dozen pairs of full-fashioned stockings. If these had been made from cotton, it is estimated, nearly 300,000 bales of staple fibre would have been required.

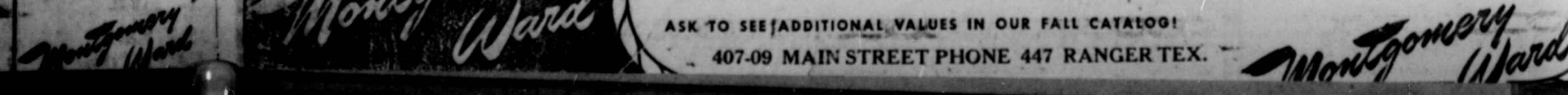

### Not Draft But Graduation Hits The Texas Aggies

COLLEGE STATION. — The football team at Texas A. and M. College, largest military school in the nation, is likely to be both eroded less by the draft than any of its Southwest Conference rivals. The reason is that most students already are taking military training and will not be called under the selective service act. All

seniors and juniors on the Aggie football team have applied for commissions.

Four sophomore players are registered for military call, but none figured prominently in Coach Homer Norton's plans for the 1941 football team.

Although Uncle Sam likely will deal kindly with the Aggies graduation did not. Gone are "Jarring John" Kimbrough, the all-American fullback, Jim Thomason, blocking back star and the whole starting lineup except Jim Sterling, all-conference end, and De-race Moser, halfback.

**Team Raked Fifth**  
Norton rates his team no better than fifth choice in the conference chase despite the great deeds of the 1939 and 1940 A. & M. eleven. A defeat by Texas last Thanksgiving Day was the only black mark on the two-year record, which included a Sugar Bowl victory over Tulane in 1940 and a Cotton Bowl triumph over Ford-ham last New Year's Day.

Norton predicts that Texas, Southern Methodist, Rice and Baylor will have better teams than A. and M. this fall, although the Cadets have 12 lettermen and a fine-looking crop of sophomores

and reserves to fill the gaps created by graduation.

Before fall training starts, Norton said that his lineup likely be Backs—Moser, Willie Zapalac, Marshall Spivey, and Jake Webster. All are lettermen except Zapalac, a very good freshman player who was held out of competition last year because the Aggies did not need his services.

Ends—Sterling and Bill "Jitterbug" Henderson or Elvis "Boots" Simmons. All lettermen, and considered by some as the three best wingmen on any Southwest team.

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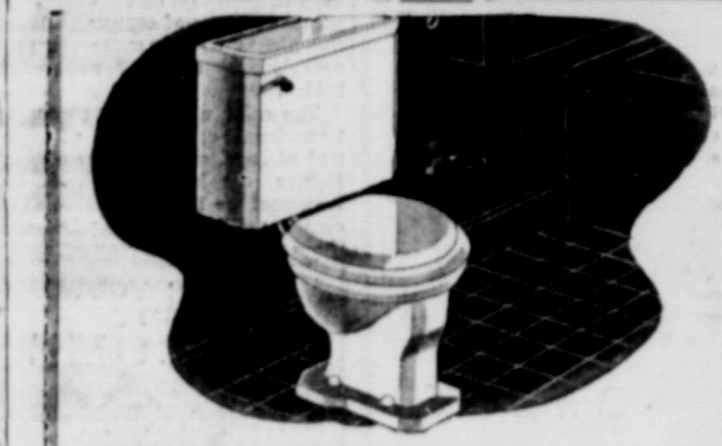

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### Air Transport Is Struggling On In Spite of War

 KANSAS CITY, Mo. — There isn't much heard these days about Europe's commercial air transportation through the shooting and bombing going on there. But planes still are flying, despite dwindling fuel stores, war-surtailed routes, camouflaged airports and restrictions in belligerent nations.

Transport flying, however, is looking ahead to its greatest expansion when the shooting stops, according to Tore Nilert, official of the Swedish A. B. Aertransport.

"Among all the difficulties of this war, there is one which was

unknown in the war of 1914-1918," he said. "That is the problem of civil air traffic."

"The civil air traffic has proved itself during the long years of peace to be a mighty and reliable helper, when ice or bad weather has stopped or made impossible other means of traveling. Therefore it was expected, when war broke out in September, 1939, that air traffic would be continued to the highest possible extent; and that all lines possible to operate would be running."

They have, insofar as possible, and so the civil air traffic became the problem child of the '39 war.

War has given it such ingenious devices as the camouflaged airports which is uncovered when planes are ready to land. That was in the first Russo-Finnish war. The Finns set fake houses and trees across runways at Abo, then built

a decoy port nearby. When the transports wireless they were coming in, machine driven winches pulled the houses and trees from the real airport and the planes landed safely in the unscarred field.

The war has crippled or amputated the commercial airlines in Europe but they are rolling with the punches and flying around and through the shellfire with circumspect regularity, according to Nilert.

A. B. A., for instance, has ceased its Stockholm-Moscow run, its flights to London, to Helsinki. But it operates from Malmo to Copenhagen and Berlin, from Stockholm to Berlin, and from Stockholm to Abo.

Flights abroad are made only in clear visibility, at stated altitudes, on instructed routes and schedules devised with cooperation of belligerents and with 200-pound coatings of orange paint on the planes which make them as conspicuous as a red-coated bridge.

ground crews across Europe passed the word, "Orange is O.K."

Nilert is spending six months in this country studying commercial air transport. He follows a Swedish air mission which last year held preliminary discussion on a New York-Stockholm line. The plane which would qualify for the new North Atlantic flight, he said, is the 56-passenger over-weather Lockheed Constellation, the first of 40 each to be delivered next spring to Transcontinental & Western Air, Inc., and Pan American Airways. There would be one stop, Nilert believed, at Botwood, Newfoundland, on the 4,000-mile flight that would take 14 hours to New York.

Nilert believes airlines will spring across the Atlantic when peace is restored and with thousands of planes and pilots available air travel and transport will be common over the civilized world.

Possibly his optimism stems from Sweden's pioneering airmail without surcharge, thus sponsoring airmail at regular postal rates throughout Europe and to

its colonies. The Swedish A.B.A. inaugurated the first flying post-office, Stockholm to London, in 1928.

If there remains any camaraderie now among warring nations, Nilert believes, much of it survives from air transport, and will be a moving power toward internationalism when the conflict ends.

Europe airlines, despite boundary and language handicaps that American air travelers hardly dream of, were breaking the isolation ice when the present war began.
