



Whereas we could normally expect thirteen cases of typhus ever during the first week , of agust, actually thirty-eight cases cere reported and the number ontinues to increase.

The rat is the animal host for the insect vestor which spreads typhus, and since hot, dry weathor favors the increase of fleas bilities of typhus transmission

Old World typhus fever had a high death rate, while the type we have in Texas, sometimes callwe have in Texas, sometimes call-ed Brill's disease, has a much lower death rate. Typhus, occurs most frequently among persons who work or live in rat-infested buildings. It was this fact that led to the discovery that rats are the carriers or transmitters of the disease.
