

#### Gift Horse

BEFORE we break into huzzahs for the enlightened patriotism of the United Auto Workers, because of the pay concessions they have voted, let's consider the record.

Exactly what is it that is to be given up-and what does the U. A. W. propose to retain? What is the background against which the proffer was made?

The union is willing that its members should work 40 hours a week for the regular pay scale. If, in the effort to keep our national plant and equipment producing to capacity, this 40-hour basic week must include Sundays or holidays, the union will not require six days' pay for five days' work. That is concession Number One. But if overtime actually is worked, the agreement does

not waive penalty scales, ordinarily at time and a half. Rather, it is left that pay for all work over 40 hours a week shall be in government bonds.

STRIPPED of all extraneities, this means that the union will contract that its members shall purchase government bonds with everything they earn through overtime work on war production.

That is a fine, patriotic gesture, worthy of emulation by anybody whose income is above the subsistence level. For it the delegates representing 534,000 workers deserve congratulations, when and if the plan becomes effective.





# Feed Is Not Feed

(Taken from The Poultry Item for October, 1940)

Dr. R. M. Bethke of the Dhio State Experiment Station and other nutrition authorities have pointed out that:

:Science has shown time and again that 'feed is not feed' and that JOHN WHITE CLAUDE (Curley) MAYNARD 100 lbs. of one feed is not necessarily equil to 100 lbs. of another For Commissioner Precinct No. 1 feed having the same general chemical analysis. One feed might be worth twice as much as the other, even though both feeds contained the same percentage of total fibre, protein, fat and minerals. This difference in feeding value is commonly referred to as 'quality.'

> "There is the old saying that a chain is only as strong as its weakest link . . and no food can be any better than the quality of the ingredients in its makeup."

"It requires knowledge and intelligence to manufacture a high-

quality feed that will do the job for which it is intended." Unfortunately, the analsis tag on a bag of feed shownig amount f protein, fat, fibre and minerals contained in a feed, tells an incomplete story. Two bags of feed made by different manufacturers may carry the same general chemical analysis as to protein, fat, fibre and minerals, but show tremendous difference when used in the poultry house or in the feed lot. This is beause feed-stuffs very in their nu-

Tests have proven that two samples of alfalfa meal may look alike and have the same general chemical analysis; but one may have a much higher carotene (Vitamin A) content than the other. Also two samples of dried milk may be identical in appearance and general chemical analysis, and one may contain twice as much riboflavin (Vitamin G) as the other. Then too . . . two samples of meat scraps may, to the eye, appear to be indentical, but one may carry a much sigher percentage of free fatty acids than the other. The one that has the lowest percentage of free fatty acids is of far greater value MAJ. R. H. (Bob) HANSFORD from a feeding standpoint

Yes . . . striking differences can and do occur in many ingredients used in livestock and poultry feeds. For some time nutrition authorities believed that there were other nutritional factors in feed much more important than the formula and chemical analysis. However, peretofore there has been little proof of this belief.

All this research and testing proved that "feed is not feed" and that quality and mixing-not feed formula alone-are of major ortance to the feeder.

High-quality feeds are not manufactured "by guess and by gally"nor "with a formula and a prayer," It takes planning, research and esting to make high-quality feeds that produce the kind of results hat the better poultrymen are getting senust gets to show profits.
