

"The Mexican government eager to cooperate with us on the abor question," McDonald said. But they want reasonable as surance, and I am convinced right so, from our federal governent that the labor that come cross the border will receive They particularly stress the necessity that living conditions be uch that laborers will not sicken and be stranded away from heir homeland.

"Because of the nearness harvest season, tightened immi war, and a demand for labor is Mexico, I am of the opinion that gration restrictions due to the little Mexocan labor will be av ailable to Texas for this harvest, McDonald stated.


