German U-Boat Rammed, Crew Captured By Canadian Destroyer in Fierce Duel
THE top photo, one of the most graphic taken during the present war, shows a German submarine shattering away from the bow of a Canadian destroyer as the destroyer attempted to ram the U-boat. The action during this encounter took place at extremely close range—often with the two vessels no more than a few feet apart. The destroyer just missed ramming the submarine when this photo was taken by a member of the crew, but her aim was more accurate and dandy a little later, and the sub was crushed by the destroyer's bow. The raider stood suspended in the ocean for a moment and then was swallowed up by the waves.

Men Make the Navy THE NAVY MAKES MEN

Q. What can a former enlisted man in the Navy expect in the way of rating should he re-enlist?
A. If a former enlisted man is found to be physically and otherwise qualified and was discharged between July 1, 1932 and December 6, 1941 with an honorable discharge, recommended for enlistment, the Navy will welcome over fifty and one-half years of age. He will be shipped over in a rating one grade higher than that held at the time of discharge.

Q. Is there a Naval R. O. T. C. training organization?
A. Yes. In 1925 Congress authorized the establishment of Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps and the first of these R. O. T. C. officers were commissioned in 1930.
