

Bob Murdock, Ralph Lambright and Loranell Hamilton were announced as the winners of the year's top civic awards at the 1983 Dimmitt Chamber of Commerce Banquet Monday night.

Murdock was named the Citizen of the Year, Lambright received the Citizen Through the Years plaque, and Mrs. Hamilton was named the Teacher of the Year.

Murdock, who at first was speechless after accepting the Citizen of the Year award from Gerald Hanners, headed for his chair and then - at the urging of friends - doubled back to the podium and exclaimed, "Anything I've done for any of you, I've done it because I love you.'

"This is the nicest thing I could have received since this is my last year of teaching," Mrs. Hamilton told the banquet audience of 351 after accepting the Teacher of the Year award. 'Thank you very much." Her award was presented by Avis Smith, last year's winner.

Lambright, who was cited by Rev. Ed Freeman for the voluntary services he provides both at the community and person-to-person levels, commented, "I enjoy doing what I do.

I like to help people. Also recognized at the banquet were members and coaches of the Dimmitt Bobcats basketball team.

And Chamber President Jim Killingsworth, master of ceremonies, paid tribute to many who "have helped make the life and conditions here better" - especially local farmers who helped clear the streets during the winter's record snowfalls, and merchants who have helped local residents cope with the hard winter and recession while supporting the programs that

benefit the community. "It's the efforts of such people on behalf of others that give small-town life a unique quality," Killingsworth commented. Killingsworth also recognized outgoing Chamber of Commerce Directors Thomas Falcon and Maxine Childers, and welcomed the newly elected directors, Calvin Marsh and Doug

After the presentation of awards, humorist James "Doc" Blakely, Ph.D., kept the audience laughing with his wit and animated tales of such experiences as bull riding and flying.

Also drawing heavy applause was Zelda Ellison, who provided dinner music.

In presenting the Citizen of the Year, Hanners praised Murdock for his work in the Dimmitt Volunteer Fire Dept. (fire chief in 1967, 1968, 1973, 1974 and 1980), the Dimmitt Kiwanis Club (president and Kiwanian of the Year in 1979-80), the Chamber of Commerce (Outstanding Community Service Award, 1980), the Dimmitt Jaycees (former director), the Dimmitt High School Key Club (advisor since 1978), the city's junior baseball programs (coach and umpire through the years), the Little Dribblers program (referee), and Dimmitt Kids, Inc. (past president).

In announcing the Citizen Through the Years winner, Rev. Freeman commented that Lambright's "God-given gift is as a helper," adding, "Wherever there is a need for someone to sit with an older person, wherever there is a need to repair a building and the finances are limited, wherever a relief cook is needed, our Citizen Through the Years is always there to

Lambright, 70, is a retired farmer and a member of the Lee Street Baptist Church, the Odd Fellows Lodge, the Castro County Senior Citizens, Veterans of Foreign Wars and American Legion. He and his wife, Velma, live at 605 W.

The Teacher of the Year for 1983 is qualified to teach a wide variety of subjects, Mrs. Smith noted.

Mrs. Hamilton, a native of Oklahoma, "taught in Oklahoma, Kansas and New Mexico before moving to Dimmitt in 1957,' Mrs. Smith explained. "She has now taught in Dimmitt 26 years and during this time she went back to school to earn a master's degree from Eastern New Mexico with a major in math, because Dimmitt needed a math teacher. She went back to school later to study science because Dimmitt needed a science teacher. Occasionally Dimmitt has needed another history teacher, and she has been called upon to take a class or two of history (which was her major for her bachelor's degree). Mrs. Hamilton also has taught adult night classes several years through the GED Program, and many of her adult students have gone on to college or specialty schools.

Part of the Comprehensive left up to the employer. Employment and Training Act, (CETA), deals with the On-The-Job-Training (OJT), Program. This program is designed to place unemployed persons in training positions with the goal of permanent employment.

These training periods range from four weeks to three and one-half months depending on the skill level

Qualified applicants will be provided to an employer for an interview for an open position. The employer is not required to hire anyone in the program.

When an applicant is selected to fill the position, he or she is placed on the employers payroll. The participant will be treated as any other employee.

The employer will be reimbursed for 50% of the participant's wages, not to include fringe benefits, for the training period. This reimbursement will be paid at the end of each month requiring only a short reimbursement form.

The participant may be terminated by the employer at anytime during the training period. The position may then be refilled by another participant or left unfilled for the duration of the training period. This decision will be




