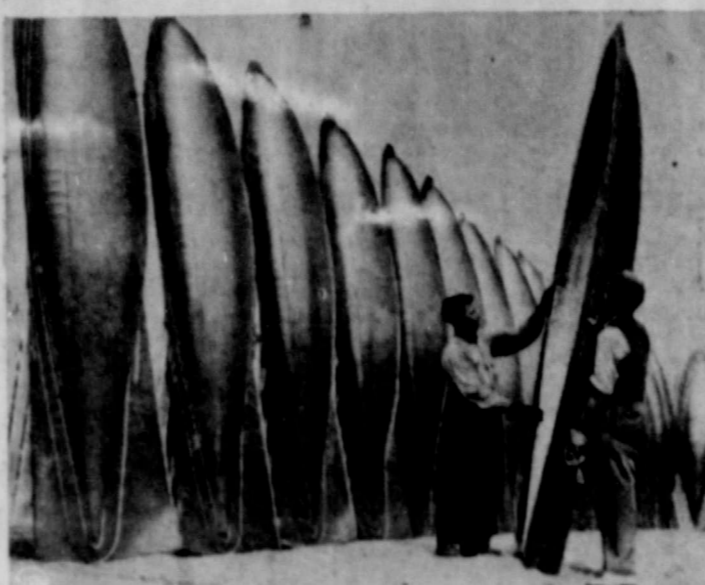
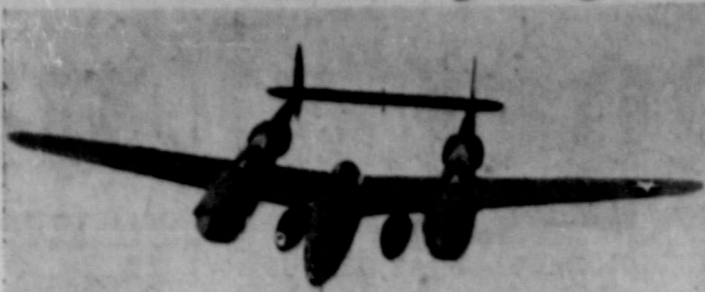

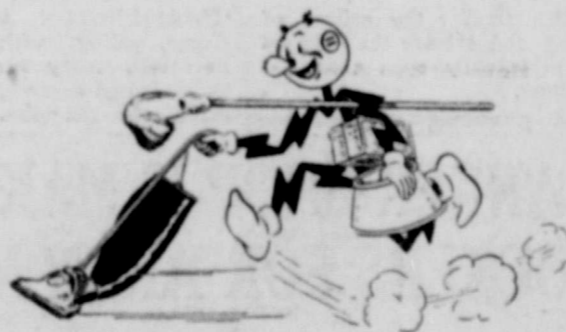

Hawaii Taps Its Forgotten Rubber

MAUNAWILI, Oahu, T. H., U.S.—First home-grown rubber has started to trickle into the nation's wartime stockpile from Hawaii, but production soon is expected to reach the equivalent of thousands of new automobile tires monthly.

On this island and Maui there are thousands of rubber trees which have not been tapped for more than 30 years.

After the turn of the century, vast numbers of the trees were planted, but the commercial venture failed and the rubber plantations since have reverted to semi-jungles.

Territorial Governor Ingram M. Stainback recently watched the tapping of 1,200 rubber trees at Maunawili. It was the Governor's idea that, although the amount would be small in comparison with national demands, Hawaii's trees should contribute all latex possible to help alleviate the shortage.

Paths have been cut through jungles to 5,000 trees at Nahiku, Maui, soon crude rubber from that island will find its way into the nation's stockpile.

Inasmuch as the trees have not been tapped for more than three decades, officials are not sure as to the exact number of productive trees in the territory but cursory surveys indicate the total may reach 10,000 or more.

Backed by a \$10,000 allotment from the territorial office of civilian defense to carry on the rubber production work, the program is well underway, although officially proclaimed to be "only in the experimental stage."

Inmates from Oahu prison currently are carrying out the program, including tapping of trees. "It is not a commercial enterprise," Gov. Stainback said, "but rather a wartime measure to augment, in a very small way, the nation's crude rubber supply."

New Guinea Plans To Reopen Rubber Plantations Acres

SOMEWHERE IN NEW GUINEA (UP)—Between 50 and 100 civilians will be returning to New Guinea shortly to resume production on about 50 rubber and copra plantations which were left behind the zone of ground operations when American and Australian troops reoccupied Papua.

Virtually the entire civilian population of New Guinea was evacuated when the Japanese landed at Lae and Salamaua last year. In most cases plantations were abandoned when their white managers were recalled to the mainland or joined the New Guinea Volunteer Rifles.

As many plantations as possible are now to be restored to their pre-war status in order to help meet the urgent demand for latex and copra.

The army has agreed to release enough native labor to work the plantations. Plantation executives who were absorbed in the army will revert to civilian life, but the management of the plantations will be under the supervision of the Australia and New Guinea Production Control Board, formed to foster and coordinate production and stabilize the recruitment of native labor.

It is believed that about 20,000 acres of rubber and 60,000 acres of copra are involved in the scheme.

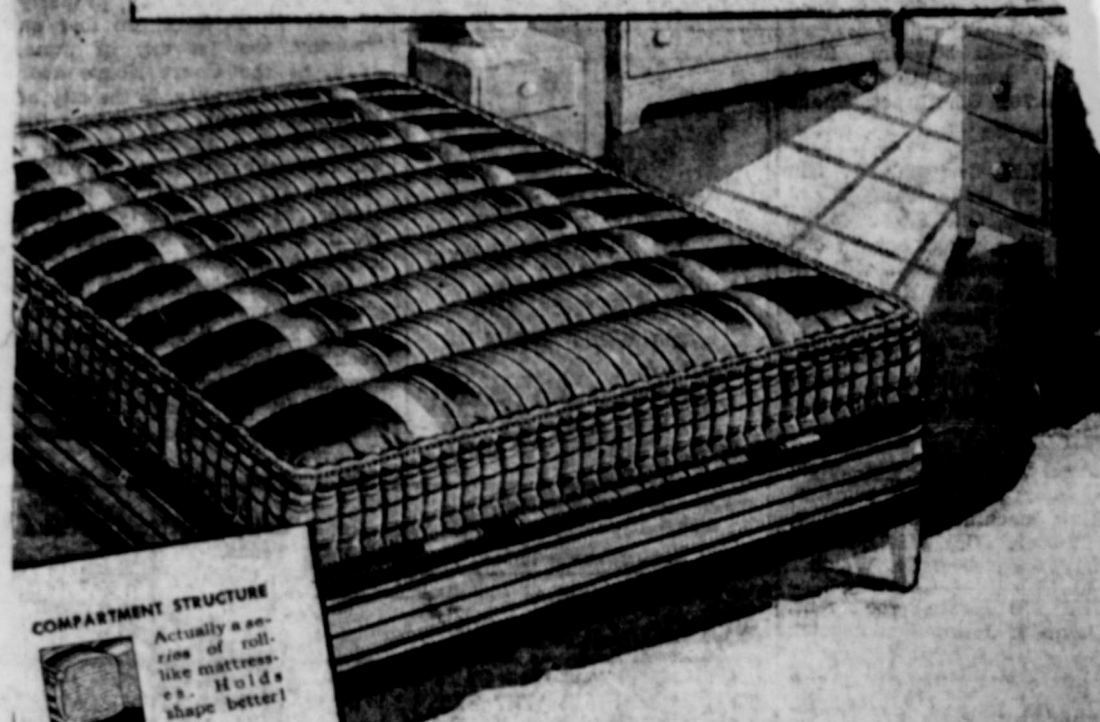

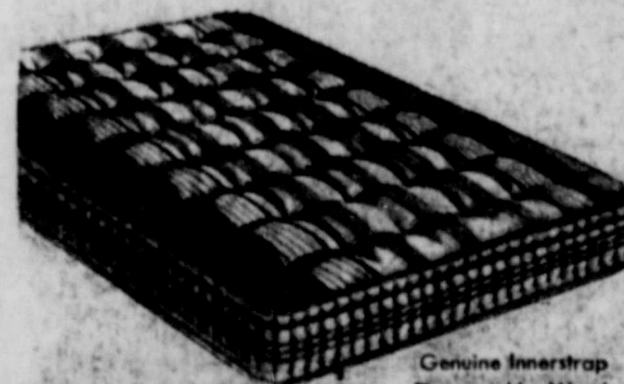

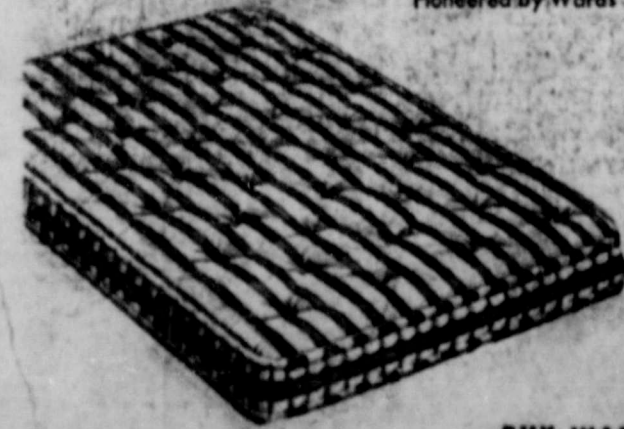
