United Press Staff Correspondent LONDON (UP)-WAC headquarters in the European theater got a shock the other day when they announced that applications would be considered for return to the United States to study at Officers Candidate School.

They dis vates would rather stay in Britain as cooks and clerks than become officers if it means a return to America. Out of more than two battalions, only five girls acceped the offer.

'We can't assure them that they will return to Britain so they don't want to go," explained Capt. Henriette Horak, San Francisco, Cal., public relations officer.

Wac enthusiasm for life in Brit ain is in marked contrast to the atttude of the average GI. The latter hangs about his Red Cross club looking lonesome and wishing he were home.

chosen at random. In answer to the questions: "What will be the effect of military living on women in the service? Will they be willing to pack their uniforms in moth balls and put on an apron again after the war? Will they be willing to settle down to quiet civilian offices again?" the Wacs had a ready ans

"We'll go on being women," one said. "When I get home I'll cook all my favorite dishes let my hair grow long, make a new cur tain for the living room, buy a pair of high heeled blue sandals, and never get up at six o'clock as long as I live."

The Wacs said that far from wanting uniforms when they are civilians again, they could best appreciate a backless evening gown and other "non-GI" luxur-

Forty seven of the 100 Wacs questioned had a snapshot of a young man in uniform tucked in their shoulder bags, sent daily Vmail letters to their men and plan to be homemakers. Some are already wives and mothers of ser-

As for the office workers, 24 Wacs were "on leave" from civilian jobs. The other 29 were just out of college and plan to begin a civilian career, maybe follow some profession learned in the Wac; six had independent incomes and spent their first "working" hours of their lives in the Army. They all were anxous to get back to civilian life as soon as possible.



### FRENCH COAST TARGETS HIT BY RAF, YANKS

LONDON, Dec. 24. (UP)-Mysterious targets along the French oast were blasted by American ombers Thursday, and it is beleved that objectives were likely the installations of the touted German rocket guns, the Nazi seret weapon.

The Allies are officially silent on the nature of these raids, but the London press, on the basis of neutral reports that the Germans were installing rocket guns in | into a world of the four free | this Axis territory closest to England, has informally named the area after the high-powered rocket gun it is said to shelter for asault on Britain.

Bomb-carrying American thunierbolt fighters attacked the important German air base near the lown of Gilze and Rijen in south ern Holland, while the northern French targets of RAF medium and light bombers included a camp near Merlimont, a small coastal rillage nineteen miles south of Boulogne, and two railway juncions, it was announced. One medium bombers was missing from hese operations.

British coastal guns pumped ells for an hour and a quarter roas the atrait of Dover and nemy convoy was believed to have been the target. German guns on the French coast replied

o the bombardment. Merlimont is just south of Etaples on the coast of the Pa De Calnie area nearest to England where the mystery targets are be-

lieved to be located. Amid growing signs that these targets, whatever their nature, were of great importance, RAF heavy bombers were disclosed to have attacked objectives in northern France along with others in western Germany Wednesday, indicating the big planes may also gineers. be taking part in the assault on the rocket gun coast.

The specific targets were not announced, but it was noted that t was unusual for the British our-engined planes, with their great bomb capacity, to turn from heir night offensives against German industrial cities such as Berlin to join in htting the northern French areas under assault by the medium daylight bombers.

### Christmas 1943 And EVERY TYPE ALLIED PLANE THROWN INTO BIG OFFENSIVE

LONDON, Dec. 24. (UP)-American heavy bombers swarmed into the unprecedented aerial onslaught on the French "rocket coast" for the first time today after British night raiders strewed flaming destruction through Berlin with more than 1,000 tons

New Christmas Story About | Music Brings Back Sailor's A Sick Seaman and a Piano Will to Live and Be Happy By HELEN ESSARY

WASHINGTON-And now-Christmas! Another Christmas in which to try to be merry.

A Shining

at desperate day, this Christmas will be in the all out war. And yet through the thick despair you may catch as I did, the light of hope and kindness. Like a good candle shining in a dark and wicked world.

I found my candle yesterday in the story of a

wounded seaman at the National Naval Medical Cen-E Light ter at nearby Bethesda, Md., and in the music that gave him back his reason and the wish to live. The seaman, we will call him Seaman Johnson, was one of those cases described in this war as the mentally depressed. The music that saved his mind was made on "The Little Brown Piano," a gift to the Red Cross Society and given by the society to the medical center. The piano has a role in my Christmas story. If this were a

E classic drama it would be the deus ex machina. The story began the day the piano was wheeled into one of the mental wards on its tour of good will. From another wing of the . hospital another patient, we shall name him Seaman Miller, was inwited to play for the mentally depressed. For the mentally depressed, I understan, there is no set treatment. Sometimes kindness and encouragement-which is kindness-restores their war-shocked nerves. Sometimes a chance word, music, the sound of a voice, lifts the distress that is clouding the spirit of the man who has seen more of misery than his soul can endure

, Miller, the patient from the outside word, had already helped many of his fellow patients. He was a fine musician and a willing one. Wherever he and the plane went they took with them a little forgetfulness from pain and anxiety

In the ward of the mentally depressed Musician Miller found little # response. Not at first. Somebody would suggest "Give us 'Oh What a Beautiful Morning,' or maybe 'Dixie.' " But the suggestions would be half-hearted. Probably they came from the nurses. Not the patients who were gathered in a big circle listening, faces expression

Th a slowly, warily, one of the mentally depressed edged his way . from the outside fringe to the circle through the crowd, toward the front row. After a while he moved to the piano and stood beside it was Seaman Johnson, one of the most hopsless of the men in

\*\* his ward. Johnson, the lad who lost interest in everything. He was one of those hard-to-rough patients the recreational workers talk about Johnson was an exaggerated case of the hard-to-reach. He had decided he did not want to live. He was doing nothing to help himself get well.

Musician Miller at once noticed the boy standing by the piano. His attitude and the sudden life in his expression showed that he liked music with the sort of liking musicians feel. Miller asked the boy to play. The boy doclined brusquely and hurried off into the back of the listening circle.

A Red Cross worker had watched Johnson at the plane. Here perhate was a chance to give the poor fellow an interest that migh help him get well. She got permission to take the Little Brown Piano to an open ward.

There she and Musician Miller persuaded Scaman Johnson to at least ait at the piano to get the feel of the keys under his hands. For a few moments he sat without moving

Then one finger found a key. Another. And another. Moving slowly, awkwardly, fearfully as if they were rediscovering a lost world.

Suddenly the boy Johnson got up from the piano. "It's no use!" he said lifelessly. "I've forgotten everything!" The other patients had heard the few frightened notes. They reilized that Johnson was somehow coming back to life. They clapped

Johnson sat down again. At first his fingers faltered as they did efore. As if they suddenly understood the touch of ivory, they began I replay music. Beautiful music. The sort you listen to big concert halls. Chopin, Grieg, Mozart and

their hands and shouted "Give us some more!

Brown "Why, you can really play, mate!" exclaimed Muflan Miller. "Where'd you study?"

Next day, however, the Little Brown Plano was again rolled into the ward of the mentally depressed. Again and again it was put be-

fore Seaman Johnson, tempting him to the music he had forgotten in the horror of war. Soon he recalled that "In Boston" meant the New England Conservatory of Music and that he had studied there for five years. After a while he was given permission to leave the locked ward

where he had been confined and go daily to the auditorium of the I wow eal center to practice on the grand plane there.

The other afternoon the medical center had a hospital talent perin formance. A hushed audience of several hundred wounded men sat in the darkened auditorium, listening. Their faces were turned toward a single light shining on the grand plane. On the eager face and the swift, sure fingers of-Seaman Johnson! Creating splendid music. It is a nice Christmas story, isn't it?


NEW YORK (UP)-"Chemical and Engineering News", publica-tion of the American Chemical Society has reported that a possi-"acute alcohol shortage" will spur agitation for making industrial alcohol from waste sulfite liquor at pulp mills.


Lynne M. Lamb, Washington correspondent for the journal, said in a survey on current conditions that "emphasis is again being put on synthetics in vital industrial emponents - fuel, alcohol, rub-

"One phase of the situation is renewed agitation for manufacture of industrial ethyl alcohol from waste sulfite liquor at paper

mills," he continued.
"The War Production Board has had before it for nearly two years lans of one or another pulp mill mpany to put this process into use to supplement industrial alcohol supplies," Lamb disclosed. The supporting argument," said, "was that such alcohol could be produced at from 18 to 20 cents per gallon, which compares with the pegged prices paid by the government for alcohol it has been zetting, approximately 50 cents, and in some cases probably high-
