Texas Hereford Association Sees Many Advances

DALLAS, Tex., (UP) — Since its organization in San Antonio 45 years ago, the history of the Texas Hereford Association has been a rags-to-riches story.

Before a handful of ranchers paid their membership dues, they raised \$1,000 for premiums to be awarded at fairs for better cattle. Their purpose was not to produce more cattle but to breed better stock that would produce finer beef at a greater profit to the grower.

A few years later, the scrub stock they had started with had turned into cattle that took prizes in every class at the Chicago International Show.

Now the Herefords represent more than 80 percent of all range stock in the state grazing in every Texas county.

Continued development of the industry on a scientific basis is seen by breeders as insurance against one-crop cotton disaster, farm tenancy and lack of diversification.
