Five Types Of Planes Now On **Navy Carriers**

of the speedy and versatile Chanc Vought Corsair (F4U-1) fighter plane to the complement of the Navy's aircraft carriers increases the number of plane types now employed in carrier service to

The Navy's first line carrier planes now include three fighter types—the Corsair, the Gruman Helleat, (F6F-5), and the Eastern Aircraft Wildcat (FM-2); one dive bomber-the Curtiss Helldiver (5B2C); and one torpedo bombes the Eastern Aircraft Avenger (TBM).

This distribution of types al lows for a number of combinations of striking power, depending on the missions required of the individual carefer or the carrier groups. The large Fast Carrier. Task Forces commanded by Vice Admirals Marc A. Mitscher, USN., and John S. McCain, USN., carry both Helldivers and Corsairs either of which can be used as a fighter or fighter bomber. They re also equipped with a sizeable force of dive bombers and torpedo bombers. The latter, combined with the fighter bombers, is the striking arm which the Navy has used to make its deepest penetr tions into enemy waters- includ

shipping off the China coast. The light, converted cru type carriers of the Independe class carry a hard hitting com-bination of fighter bombers Hel cats and Corsairs-plus a squad ron of Avengers. These ships and aircraft furnish an added punch

to the Fast Carrier Forces. The eacort carriers, widely known as "baby flattops," carry the sturdy little Wildcats for fighter protection and their big sisters the Avengers for bombardment and patrol work. This team has proved to be an invaluable addition to the close air support which carrier aircraft now furn ishes amphibious troops invading enemy isalnds across the Pacific. Their offensive power was well proved in the second battle of the Philippine Sea when a small group of escort carriers turned back a vastly superior force of Japanese battleships cruisers and destroyers attempting to break up the landings on Leyte.



Five Types Of Planes Now On Navy Carriers

DALLAS, March 7 - Additio of the speedy and versatile Chance Vought Corsair (F4U-1) fighter plane to the complement of the Navy's aircraft carriers increases the number of plane types now employed in carrier service to

The Navy's first line carrie planes now include three fighter types—the Corsair, the Gruman Helleat, (F6F-5), and the East ern Aircraft Wildcat (FM-2); one dive bomber-the Curtiss Helldiv er (SB2C); and one torpede bomber the Eastern Aircraft Avenger (TPM).

This distribution of types al lows for a number of combina tions of striking power, depend-ing on the missions required of the individual earrier or the car rier groups. The large Fast Car-Vice Admirals Marc A. Mitscher, USN., and John S. McCain, USN., carry both Helldivers and Corsairs either of which can be used as a fighter or fighter bomber. They are also equipped with a sizeable force of dive bombers and torpedo bombers. The latter, combined with the fighter bombers, is the striking arm which the Navy has used to make its deepest penetra tions into enemy waters- includ ing the recent attack on Jap

shipping off the China coast.

The light, converted cruiser type carriers of the Independence bination of fighter bombers Hell cats and Corsairs-plus a squad ron of Avengers. These ships and aircraft furnish an added punch to the Fast Carrier Forces.
