

Diplomates See Long Absences **Hurting Corps**

DIPLOMATS SEE 18 PtexyiHi WASHINGTON (UP)-Spokeson for the United States foreign ervice believe that "without any ault of their own," the nation's areer diplomats are "hitting on nly five out of eight cylinders.

The compliment came from the American Foreign Service Journat, official organ of the govern-ment's 750 career diplomats. It harged that long assignments out ide the country, outmoded State Department practices and poor sal-aries had instilled "a sense of reoteness, fustration and general nadequacy" in American embas-sies throughout the world.

What's more, it said, there's too uch "deadwood" in the upper

The journal took its own organ ation-as well as the State Deartment-to task in a special arcle analyzing 60 manuscripts submitted by diplomats in an es-say contest on what's wrong with country's diplomatic corps.

"Perhaps the most frequently voiced suggestion," the article said, was that of "closer contact with the Department and the Uni-

touch with the trend of thought in Washington, and insufficiently familiar with the changing Ameri-

Most of the essays urged a regucoper, Sr. during the week-end. service officers back to Washing ton every four, five or six years. Periodic leaves of absence, they said, should be made obligatory 'at government expense" to bring diplomats back home for a look at

changing conditions.

Charging that "too slow" promotions had stifled development of promising young diplomats, the journal also expressed fear that men unable to qualify for regular diplomatic assignments would be "suddenly incorporated into the higher brackets of the service."

Almost all the essay contestants demanded "increased and realistic allowances" to cover expenses enountered in foreign posts. They noted that "spasmodic waves of false economy had damaged efficient operation of the diplomatic


