OKULICKI FIGURES AMONG RUSSIANS' 16 FOLISH POLITCAL PRISONERS By Peter Edson, NEA Service Staff Correspondent.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 11 Key figure among the 16 Polish leaders held under arrest by the Russians since April 30 is Brig. Gen. Leopold Okulicki, whose full told. He is in no sense a political leader, as are the other 15 in this group which disappeared under such mysterious circumstances, to the embarrassment of the harmonius relationship of major United Nations powers, but few men did more to further the advance of the Red Armies across Peland and thi sfact alone makes

his detention by the Russians all the more incomprehensible.

Fought Germans to Last O'kulicki was a colonel in the Polish Army when the war broke out in 1939. He fought the Germans until the last, then surren dered as a prisoner of war to the Russians. He was released in 1941 after the Stalin-Sikorski pact of mutual friendship and was evacuated with the Polish armies to the Middle - East. When these Polish units were transferred to the Italian front, O'kulieki went along as chief of staff, staying in that post forces were officially designated.




