Anniversary Of WAC Celebrated At Camp Wolters

CAMP WOLTERS, Texas, May 14 — Today is the third anniversary of the Women's Army Corps and the Wacs of the detachment here celebrated the event with a picnic yesterday.

Originally called the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps, it was a unit somewhat set aside from the Army and yet worked as closely as possible with it. However, in July 1942, a major change was brought about that made the Corps a part of the Army itself. Since that time the training and utilization of women in the Army has become progressively more simple and effective, and a more natural relationship has been established between the Army as a whole and its newest type of soldier.

LT. HATTEN IS LIBERATED FROM GERMANS

Mrs. Frank Hatten received word Sunday that her husband, Lt. Hatten, who has been a prisoner of the Germans has been liberated by Allied Forces.

Lt. Hatten, a B-17 Flying Fortress pilot was first reported missing in action over Germany on May 24, 1944 and later was reported a prisoner of the Germans as of that date.

Promoted to first lieutenant after being sent to foreign service he holds the Air Medal and at least one Oak Leaf Cluster for meritorious achievement on ten combat missions over enemy Europe.

RANGER'S 7TH LOAN QUOTA IS HEAVY ONE

The 7th and greatest of all War Loan drives opened officially Monday and the people of Ranger have been called upon to make the greatest purchase in series E bonds of any other drive.

Ranger's quota is \$92,000 in Series E Bonds and this amount will have to be raised by individuals since corporations and other institutions are not allowed to buy this series.

CAPTURE OF CONICAL HILL UNHINGES JAP DEFENSE LINE, EXPOSES ENEMY FROM REAR

American Forces on Okinawa moved to outflank the Japanese strongholds of Naha and Shuri today after capturing Conical Hill, east coast anchor position of the enemy line across the island.

Both towns held out against savage frontal attacks, but capture of the hill unhinged the defense line and exposed them from the rear.

A gain of a mile and a quarter which accompanied the campaign for capture of the hill—the best American advance in two weeks. It took them to within half a mile of the east coast port of Yonabaru and enveloped Yonabaru air- (The Philippines, now progress was recorded both on Luzon and Mindanao. Troops of the 25th Infantry Division broke through the narrow Balate pass leading to the Cagayan valley gateway to northern Luzon. Units of the 32nd Division reached open ground two miles away and both columns were converging on Santa Fe.

CPL. E. C. LEE GIVEN BRONZE STAR AWARD

Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Lee of Rt. 2, Ranger have received word that their son, Cpl. Edwin V. Lee, who has been serving in the European theatre of operations has been awarded the Bronze Star Medal for heroic achievement in connection with military operations.

The citation states that the award was made for achievement in military operations against the enemy in the vicinity of St. Laurent-Mer, Normandy, France 6 of June, 1944. The citations reads further, "Throughout the critical period of a bitterly contested engagement with the enemy, Pvt. Lee despite constant heavy bombardment, made numerous trips across hazardous terrain and delivered needed ammunition. His tireless efforts and outstanding courage enabled artillery to give close support to attacking troops."

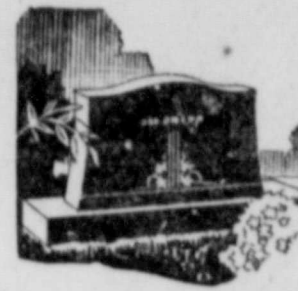
