Expert On Soil

Helps Farmers

CHAMPAIGN URBANA, BL. UP) -Soil tests so accurate that they have been used to detect the ocation of prehistoric graves, even where no visigle traces of graves remained, have been deveoped by Dr. Roger H. Bray, professor of soil fertility at the University of Illinois.

By disclosing the presence of phosphorous left by decomposed bones, the tests revealed the extent of a burial ground used by man centuries ago. They even lim ted the size of a prehistoric vi lare, when occupied over a long period of time, because accumul tion of bones of animals eaten by the villagers, and human excreta made lasting changes in the soil Capital Hearings


