WASHINGTON (UP) — The War Production Board has acted to assure civilians of an ample supply of blankets this winter. It revoked an order which has kept

a 100 per cent freeze on wool blankets to fill military requirements.

The Army has reduced its third quarter requirements for wool blanketing by 5,000,000 yards. This is approximately the civilian quarterly demand, the WPB said.

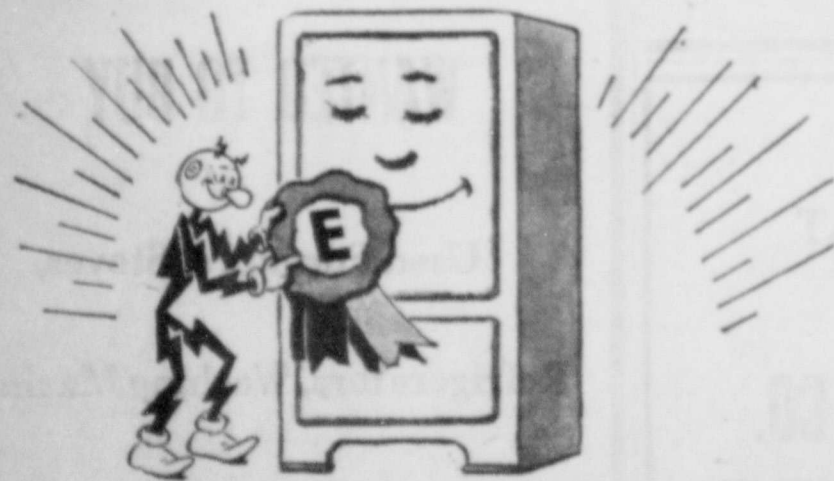
