## League Football Teams 100 More Than Last Year

AUSTIN, Tex.—More than 100 schools who did not take part in the University of Texas Inter-scholastic League football last year are in the competition this

year, Rodney J. Kidd, athletic director for the League has reported.

Exactly 740 schools are taking part in all football conferences, and last year 638 schools took part.

Conference B teams increased from 171 schools participating in 1944 to 218 this year, Mr. Kidd said. Six man teams increased from 93 last year to 150 this year.
