Materials To Be Available In 60 Days For Vets

Virtually all of the government's war surplus building materials and equipment will be made available for veterans housing within 60 days, War Assets Administration announced Friday. Hamilton Morton, Fort Worth WAA regional director, has been called upon by Washington, along with 32 other regional directors throughout the nation to take im-

mediate action for complete disposal of such surplus goods by December - under a streamlined sales plan, the objective of which is to turn all of the war-leftover building supplies and equipment back into private construction channels.

The surplus includes builders hardware, plumbing and heating equipment, and materials and equipment needed by utility companies for extending service to homes built under the veteran emergency housing program.

Before such property is offered for sale under the standard WAA disposal policy, it will be held for 10 days to give FPHA and VA a chance to obtain it for their own use in connection with veteran housing and hospital projects. Then it will be sold, during an initial offering period, only to HH certifiers (building private houses for veterans) and MM certifiers (building veterans hospitals) upon direction from the housing expediter or the Civilian Production Administration, respectively.

NEAR RECORD MILK SUPPLY FOR COUNTY

Eastland County residents will consume more than 7,575,000 quarts of milk and milk products this year in maintaining the county's high nutritional standards, it was predicted today by the nation's leading distributor of dairy products.

"With a near record supply of milk coming from the nation's dairy farms, consumption of dairy products this year will nearly

equal that of 1945 when more than 60,000,000 quarts were consumed," said G. W. Diehl, head of A&F Food stores' national dairy department. "A 22 per cent increase in per capita consumption of milk during the war years helped overcome the loss of nutrition caused by curtailed supplies of fats and oils and helped bring about the nation's high nutritional wartime levels."

An increased supply of most cheese products is now available in many sections of the country and other milk products are expected to be adequate during the fall and winter months, Diehl said. These products contain nearly 14 per cent of the calories, 24 per cent of the proteins, 18 per cent of the fats, 74 per cent of the calcium and 45 per cent of the riboflavin consumed by the average individual.

The pioneering efforts of food chains in developing a streamlined distribution system, Diehl said, have made possible the quick movement of milk and milk products from dairy centers to densely populated consumer areas. Modern refrigeration equipment and improved handling methods were also cited as instrumental in maintaining the high nutritional qualities of dairy products.

Eastland County's 2,500 farms are expected to produce more than 8,200,000 quarts of milk this year.

Dayton Seeks Airfields For Veteran Housing

DAYTON, O. (UP)—Officials of two counties in Ohio are dreaming on a large scale—the plan calls for approximately 114,000 one, two and three-room apartments at rentals for the thinnest purse.

The plan calls for the conversion of concrete army barracks at Wright and Patterson fields, financed by appropriations allotted under the new Ohio GI housing law.

Montgomery and Greene County commissioners emphasize that the proposed conversion is a separate action from a recent request that some 500 families leave low-rent federal houses because their incomes exceed the legal limit.
