The Garrison dam would inundate about 275,000 acres of land they have left -the only bottom and remaining to them.

So far the Indians have rejectthree informal suggestions, and they claim they will reject any other offers. They say they will not move even if comparable botcause they regard the homes of carried on until 1938.


