## HOPE GIVES ANSWER TO JUVENILE CRIME, MAN SAYS

ALBANY, N. Y. (UP) — Lewis E. Lawes, former warden of New York State's famous Sing Sing Prison, has a one-word answer to the problems of curbing juvenile delinquency and rehabilitating criminals.

"Hope" is Lawes' word. "Give a man hope and you won't have a criminal. By the same token, give a boy hope and you won't have the makings of a criminal," he believes.

"Of course, it's up to us in the community to help," Lawes told businessmen and social workers here. "If we had less competition and more co-operation among our social agencies, we'd have less juvenile delinquency."

The ex-warden likes to point to the thousands of prisoners and parolees who turned out a "tremendous" amount of war products, and the 150,000 prisoners who saw combat service.

Deepening of the Hickok Producing & Development Company's Wright & Harrell No. 6 to 4200' is now in process. This well is located in the Lee Ray Deep Field, Eastland County in Tract 14, J. B. Hoxie Survey 460' from the North and 660' from East line of this Tract.

Log of the Cities Service Oil Company (Pa.) W. T. Hittson "B" No. 1 in Sec. 2, SP RR Company Survey, Eastland County, Leary Field, indicated that the well was completed November 20 as an oil well at a total depth of 3358 with the sand from 3343 to 3358.

The Magnolia Petroleum Company's M. W. McMini well number 9 drilled in the Olden townsite as a core test well only to a depth of 1485 and the oil sand found from 1482 to 1485.

Official records show that the H. W. Snowden et al W. J. Donovan well number 3 in section 488, SP RR Survey, Eastland County, was completed on October 18, and potential 66 barrels of crude oil in a twenty-four period with a gas-oil ratio of 1000-1, and 42 gravity oil. The well had previously been shot in but they were rare.

# Soft Coal Production Begins Again Today

## HARDIN SENIOR COLLEGE GETS BUILDING GIFT

WICHITA FALLS, Tex. Dec. 9.—John F. O'Donohue, president of the board of trustees of Hardin College at Wichita Falls has announced a recent gift to the college by Mr. and Mrs. W. P. Ferguson of that city for the purpose of erecting an animal husbandry building on the campus. Hardin Senior College was established last summer in connection with Hardin Junior College which is publicly supported and privately endowed. The animal husbandry building will be of steel and concrete fireproof construction and will house ten classrooms, laboratories, library and reading room, and offices.

Dr. James B. Boren, president of the college said, "The Animal Husbandry building is the first unit of the Hardin College School of Agriculture and should be ready to be occupied by next September." He also stated that a cold storage plant will be erected on the college campus in the near future for the preservation of dairy products, poultry products, beef, pork, etc., produced on the college ranch. These products together with the fruit and vegetables produced and processed on the college farm will be used by the college cafeteria which will feed about two thousand students.

It would appear that college doors have finally swung open to practical farmers and ranchmen. G. S. Dowell, dean of the school of agriculture and director of the vocational division of the college said: "The agriculture program at Hardin exists for those who want to study practical agriculture."

While we will offer a bachelor of science degree in agriculture there will be a place in the program for anybody who wants to become a better farmer or ranchman regardless of whether he can attend college four years or four weeks, whether he graduated from high school or quit school at the end of the third or fourth grade. If it's practical agriculture Hardin will have it." Government buildings have been secured for dairy barns, beef cattle barns, hog houses, chicken houses, and farm shops and bund houses, and will be moved onto the college property during the next few weeks. Living quarters and part time jobs on the farm, ranch, and college campus will be provided for a large number of boys who need help to attend college.

At a public meeting of more than two hundred people throughout the territory of Wichita Falls, ranchers, farmers, business men, agriculture and vocational experts pronounced the program unique in the agriculture and college world and pledged their support.

## Russia Expected To Turn Down Byrnes' Demand

NEW YORK — A flat Russian "no" was expressed today on Secretary of State James F. Byrnes' demands that the Soviets cut their troop strength in occupied Europe and launch German peace talks immediately.

The Russian answer threatened the first showdown in Big Four foreign ministers consideration of peace terms for Germany, and may go far toward charting the nations course in what Byrnes regards as the world's number one international headache.

## EGYPT JOINS FRANCE IN UN TROOP DEBATE

LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y.—Egypt joined France in the United Nations disarmament debate today with a proposal that all members begin calling home their armies abroad and start general demobilization of their armed forces.

Egypt submitted an amendment to the disarmament resolution being drafted by a subcommittee of the political and security committee calling for "the gradual and balanced withdrawal" of forces of UN members "stationed outside their own territories" and demobilization of their own forces.

The wording was similar to that of a French amendment. But the Egyptian amendment also called for UN members to withdraw their armed forces from the territory of other members where they are stationed without consent "without delay."

The full political and security committee was scheduled to meet this afternoon and one of the assembly's sharpest battles was expected over a resolution recommending that all UN members break diplomatic relations with the Franco government of Spain.

## Shipbuilders Profits Report Is Staggering

WASHINGTON — A Congressional committee was told today that 19 shipbuilding companies grossed an estimated \$356,006,612 in wartime profits on invested capital totaling \$22,979,275.

One company was said to have made an estimated profit of \$2,050,000 on a \$500 capital investment.

## FEW MINERS HOLD OUT FOR OFFICIAL WORD FROM LEWIS

PITTSBURGH — The Nation's soft coal production surged today as United Mine Workers ended their two and a half week strike. Reports indicated that more than 280,000 miners were back in the pits as day shifts reported across the nation.

The back to work march started early today in the eastern fields and the working force grew hourly. Night shifts will swell the total—some miners still awaited "official" notice of John L. Lewis strike cancellation order, but were reported to return as soon as local union meetings could be held.

In the rich fields surrounding Pittsburgh, the Solid Fuels Administration reported today's production will reach 242,000 tons with 44,330 miners checking into the pits. Only 16 mines, employing 3,180 men and producing 16,580 tons a day remained closed. Absentees at open pits, however was reported at about 20 per cent compared with a normal of six per cent.

With the resumption of coal production, employment in coal consuming industries began to climb. Railroad workers were recalled and furlough for factory workers cancelled. But the steel industry, hampered by cooled furnaces and short coal supplies, was not expected to reach pre-strike operational rates for 10 days to two weeks.

EDITORIAL

RUSSIA'S CHANGE OF HEART

Mr. Molotov's about-face on the question of a veto power over armament inspection had an inevitably dissimilar reception. Some held it to be the clinching proof of the Soviet's amiable co-operativeness and ardent desire for peace.

At present, however, one thing is certain. No amount of misgivings can outweigh the hopefulness inspired by the Russian change of heart. This does not mean an end of difficulties, of course. Russia will not abandon the veto until she can agree to the control and inspection system.

The heartening thing is that one of the biggest disagreements between Russia, this country and Britain has made great progress toward settlement. The small day-to-day differences can be borne. Even though Russia insists on her Security Council veto in all other matters, there is more hope for peace now than at any time in the UN's short history.

But there are still some formidable obstacles to be cleared. One is the creation of a disarmament program and of an inspection system that can really enforce it. Any international inspection system will require some sacrifice of sovereignty. And the making of that sacrifice will demand an entirely new and courageous sort of diplomatic thinking.

Then there is the matter of removing some of the non-military causes of international friction. Here the outlook is far from encouraging.

Russia has not participated in the UNESCO meetings or taken part in the international trade discussions.

Her disavowal of the UNESCO program because it did not take into account the Marxist materialistic philosophy has not caused much general concern. Yet until Russia sees fit to participate in a world program of information, education and cultural co-operation and joins in drafting world trade agreements, we have not come far on the road to peace.

Nevertheless, Mr. Molotov's concession is tremendously encouraging. It looks like the break that was bound to come if the UN was to survive.

Russia may continue to veto discussions and actions. But if the world can be sure that Russia and the other nations are actually and sincerely disarming, a great and present threat of peril will be lifted.

Under The Dome At Austin

AUSTIN, Tex. (UPI)—Any office seeker or lobbyist who got a ticket on the railroad special to the presidential inauguration in Mexico City with the idea it would give him access to the car of Texas Gov.-Elect Beauford Jester made a bad investment.

The Texas governor-elect was booked for the train all right. It left San Antonio the night of Nov. 27. But in the meantime a group of Jester's townsmen insisted on seeing him in Austin Nov. 28. So Jester looked up the air schedules and decided to go by airplane. This decision also permitted him to see the annual Thanksgiving Day game between Texas University and Texas A. & M. College.

Jester already had arranged to return from Mexico city by air in order to be home in time to participate in a conference on his proposal to set up a state commission to look after welfare of veterans.

But even if the governor-elect had taken the train, there would have been little access to him. He said he had planned to use the time in making the 1,000-mile journey to catch up on a lot of correspondence and documents he wants to read in preparation for taking over his duties as governor.

When Jimmy Phillips of Angleton was a state representative for Matagorda and Brazoria counties he made it a practice to return every weekend that the house was not in session and confer with the folks back home.

Jimmy wasn't able to come home from the army week ends for his discussions with the people, but when he did get out of army life for good the people of Matagorda and Brazoria counties joined with those of Chambers, Fort Bend, Wharton and Galveston counties to promote him to state senator.

The formula seems to be catching on at other places. In fact, some of the legislators-elect already are holding conferences with their constituents.

Here in Texas there is prospect of a contest over an election to the State House of Representatives.

The anticipated challenge is directed at Representative-elect Donald Peters of Cotulla, Tex., one of 28 students of the university in the house membership. The house votes on seating its own members after report from the secretary of state on results of the election. Peters resigned recently from the university.

The spring suddenly had increased its flow with the new surface opening.

Result: The spring is now the center of a huge bathing pool, said to be one of the largest in the United States. It is 215 feet in diameter and has two rectangular wings 215 feet long and 75 feet wide. The spring sends out 26,000,000 gallons of water a day.
