WARNS SOIL EROSION LOSS

WASHINGTON (UP)- The Department of Agriculture warns that much of the world's best productive land is washing into the sea in the face of a steady in-

crease in population, which will require more and more food. It added that even though the United States is "better off" than any other nation when its tillable is compared with its food

needs, there still is "no reason for complacency.' The department said bad farming practices which result in ero-sion still are costing the United Carolina (NA Telephote) States about 500,000 acres of good farm land a year. This is a big improvement over the period between 1895 and 1930, when

the loss averaged nearly 1,000, 000 acres a year, however. On a world-wide basis there is only about 4,000,000,000 acres of arable land left, although the population is more than 2,000,-
