Farm Editor Says Truman Knows His Turkey

FORT WORTH — President Truman knows his turkeys.

Take it from Layne Beaty, farm editor of radio station WBAP Fort Worth, the chief executive knows exactly how to handle the birds—particularly one scheduled for his own Christmas dinner.

Beaty, who has just returned from a visit to the White House, was on hand when President Truman was presented with a 42-pound Texas tom. The presentation was planned by the Poultry and Egg National Board. Everything went smoothly, according to Beaty, until photographers asked that the lid of the turkey coop be removed for a better picture.

Then it happened. The big tom began flapping his wings, and for a moment it looked as if the president's Christmas drumsticks would be flying out the nearest window. But the man from Missouri thought otherwise. Acting as if he

had just stepped from a turkey ranch, he correctly pinioned the bird's wings. The turkey was back down in the coop for the count.

The 42-pound tom was grown on the ranch of R. E. Janes, Austin, Texas. Janes is the president of the National Turkey Federation. Farm editor Beaty also attended the National Association of Radio Farm Directors in Chicago. He was elected president of the association for the coming year.

Examinations For Health Units To Be Given

AUSTIN, Tex.—Competitive examinations for positions in the Local Health Units and the State Department of Health have just been announced by the Merit System Council for the Texas State Department of Health. Examinations are for public health sanitation positions, and will consist of a written examination and an evaluation of training and

experience. Veterans preference will be allowed applicants who have been honorably discharged from the United States armed forces and who make a passing score on the examination.

All applications must be mailed before midnight January 18, 1947. Positions for which examinations will be held, and their entrance salaries, are: Sanitarian (\$160) and Senior Sanitarian (\$210). Application blanks may be obtained from Russell E. Shrader, Merit System Supervisor, Littlefield Building, Austin, Texas.

NEW YORK (UP)—The greatest production of crude oil in the 87-year history of the American petroleum industry was achieved during 1946, according to William B. Boyd, Jr., president of the American Petroleum Institute. "We have ample reserves to meet all demands for liquid fuels and lubricants in the foreseeable future," he added. "We also have

plentiful stocks of gasoline and heating oils for the winter season."

Accompanying production, he pointed out, was an unprecedented demand for petroleum products and increased realization of the importance of natural gas not only as a source of heat and energy, but as a source from which liquid fuels, lubricants, and other products presently made from crude oil can be manufactured.

New discoveries in South Texas and along the Gulf Coast of Mississippi, increased production in the Rockies and the potential production of the Continental Shelf are adequate protection against the country's running out of oil or gas for many years to come, Boyd said.

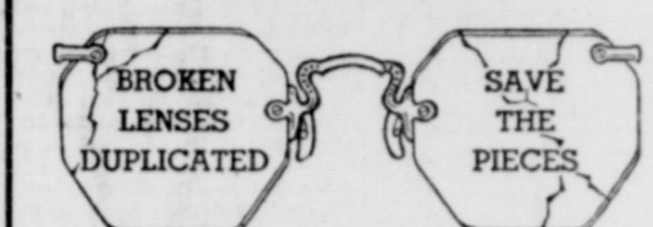

Resistance Of Buyers Hits Retailers

NEW YORK (UP) — Benjamin H. Namm, president of the National Retail Dry Goods Association, predicted today that "frantic indiscriminate" consumer buying probably will lend in 1947 a new warning that inferior goods will meet increasing resistance by the public.

He urged retailers to renew their cautious buying practices discarded during the war if they are to avoid "a glut of unsalable merchandise and serious inventory losses for both retailers and manufacturers such as precipitated the 1921 crash."

While a retailer who restores his buying and selling policies to a "sound, common sense basis" in 1947 "may well sacrifice some of his potential sales and profits," such action "will be a small price to pay for insurance against disastrous inventory losses and a damaging setback to the country's business," according to Namm, chairman of the Namm Store, Brooklyn, N.Y.

"If retailers as a whole follow sound buying policies during the coming year," he continued, "their influence will be felt throughout our entire economy. They can play a major role in preventing a repetition of a boom and bust such as followed the last war."

FALL RIVER, Mass. (UP) — Mrs. Alfred Borden made money when a thief broke into her home and stole \$500 worth of jewelry.
