

TEXAS CITY-Trucks laden with unestimated numbers of dead rolled in a steady stream into Texas City's main morgue today as recovery squads protected by gas masks and thick gloves dug through the rubble of the Monsanto Chemical plant and this town's waterfront area.

The parade of vehicles bearing the bodies began about 10 A.M. when two trucks, loaded with 20 to 24 bodies. backed up at the downtown garage serving as a temporary morgue and began unloading.

Observers lost count after that. They said that "truckload after truckload" was arriving at the mortuary.

An officer of the Texas Department of Public Safety . who was the only official possessing authority to give out information at the morgue was on a tour of the waterfront area and was not available immediately to reporters.

The dockyard's Capt. C. V. Shown of the Houston police department, in charge of police operations in the port, said he lost count after eight or ten bodies were recovered from the sugar slip where the Grand Camp blew


