WAA Clearance Sale To Be Held At Carbon Plant

SEAGRAVES (Special)—An emergency site clearance sale at the Columbian Carbon Company plant, three miles west of Seagraves on the Denver City highway, has been scheduled by War Assets Administration for May 19 and 20. According to Jack Ball, crew chief at the plant for the location sales division of the Grand Prairie regional WAA office, personal property which originally cost the government \$25,000 will be offered for sale to the highest bidders in lots which include related items.

Ball pointed out that at this sale no priorities will be required and that any person will be welcome to make an inspection of the property and place a bid. Inspection may be on Monday, May 19, from 8:30 a. m. until 4:30 p. m. and on the following day, Tuesday, from 8:30 a. m. to 11 a. m. at which time the bid boxes will be opened and awards will be made to the successful high bidders who must be present to claim their purchases.

Property to be offered, Ball stated, includes industrial equipment, hardware, electrical supplies, hand tools, building and plumbing materials, fence wire, office furniture, railroad ties, welding machines and equipment and gate valves.

Critical Jury Oks Crafts Production

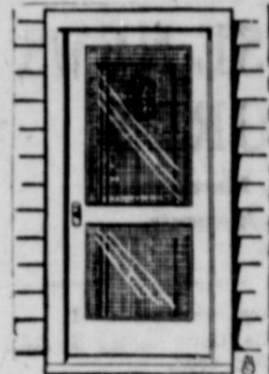
BOSTON (UP)—There's a salesroom in Boston's Back Bay exhibiting only articles which have won the approval of a critical jury.
