



Irving Berlin's Song Arranger Has His Own Hit But Doesn't Enthuse

United Press Staff Correspondent NEW YORK (UP)-It took fame 16 years to catch up with Helmy Kresa, author of the song hit "That's My Desire," but as far

Bands from coast to coast are playing "Thats My Desire." It's on the Hit Parade. Juke boxes are blaring it. Singers are singing it. But Kresa doesn't much care

"I'm the musical stenographer as he's concerned it can pass him for Irving Berlin the greatest song writer of them all," Helmy said. "That's all I want. The rest of it is just so much leing on the cake.

"Songwriters keep coming up here, all day long. 'Let's team up

Helmy,' they say. But no. I turn them away."

Kresa, at 42, is production manager and arranger for Berlin. He has arranged every song the Old Master has written since "Blue

Skies " in 1927. "I wrote 'That's My Desire' back in 1931," Kresa said. "I was more ambitious then. I would have really enjoyed a hit. And I thought it was a good song. I still think so. But it died early then."

Then last spring, on the West Coast, a night club singer named Frankie Lane needed a new song.
A friend taught him "That's My Desire." Frankie didn't know who wrote it. He didn't even have sheet music for it. Kresa, himself, was contentedly doing his job in the Berlin offices on Broadway. He had no idea the song was being used at all.

"One day Sid Mills, professional manager of Mills Music Co., telephoned me," Kresa Recalled.

"He said, 'Hey, I gotta surprise'."
It was a recording of Frankie
Lane singing "That's My Desire." "I was like any proud papa, Helmy said. "When I first heard it like that, it got me all excited inside. I darn near cried."

When a song-writer has a hit, he ives in a purple cloud. People pat nim on the back and praise him. Every man is his pal.

"But it won't lure me into the song-writing end of it again," Kresa said. "I'm too contented here with Mr. Berlin, You know why? Because he's got a million beautiful songs in his head. When
