Earmarked For Future Communist Harvest



Index Of Farm Prices Rises In Month Of July

WASHINGTON — The agriculture department's index of farm prices rose to 276 on July 15, two per cent above the mid-June mark of 271. The new increase was the first since March and moved the index within 1.4 per cent of the March peak index of 280.

While prices received by farmers were rising, the parity price index—prices paid by farmers—remained stationary at its all-time peak of 231. As a result, farmers on July 15 were receiving 19 per cent more than parity for their products on the average. Farm prices were 17 per cent higher than parity during the previous period.

In these indexes, 100 is the average for 1909-1914. Advances in the prices of most farm products more than offset sharp declines in the average price of fruits and truck crops.

Asks Investigation Of Indonesia Fight

LAKE SUCCESS — Indian formally demanded United Nations intervention in the Indonesian conflict today, calling on the UN Security Council to investigate the situation as soon as possible. An Australian request for action under stronger sections of the UN charter than those invoked by India was ready for submission to the UN momentarily.

Britain Bans War Materials To Dutch Indies

LONDON — Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin told Commons today that Britain had banned the supply of war materials to the Dutch East Indies from the United Kingdom, Singapore and British territories in the far east. Bevin said the government also had forbidden the use of British

training facilities in the far east by the belligerents.

He said he had received no further response to Britain's offer to mediate the Dutch-Indonesian dispute.

Jail May Become Museum
GATESVILLE, Tex. (UP)—Coryell county's first publicly owned building—a double log jail built in 1855—may soon become a museum.

A campaign has been started by a group of citizens headed by R. L. (Bob) Saunders, a pioneer, to raise funds to have the old jail moved from its present site two miles east of town to Raby Park. It will be restored to its original state.
