Valley Has More Oil Than Water

McALLEN, Tex. (UP)—Stream pollution from oil wells, the hazy of East Texas and other oil areas that have water or well as oil, presents no problems in the lower Rio Grande Valley, because most of the time there's more oil than water.

With the exception of the Arroyo Colorado the valley has no streams. The Colorado would be dry approximately 300 days of the year. The Rio Grande is irrigated lands, for seepage from one of the richest agricultural centers in the world, an average of only 17 inches of rain has fallen annually in the last 10 years. Storage dams and highly scientific irrigation have protected the area. Since the ground is impregnated with sodium chloride and sodium sulphate, the oil produced here is almost as good to drink as a lot of the water.

"Take the No. 2 coach on Second Avenue, down by the liquor store," said the driver.

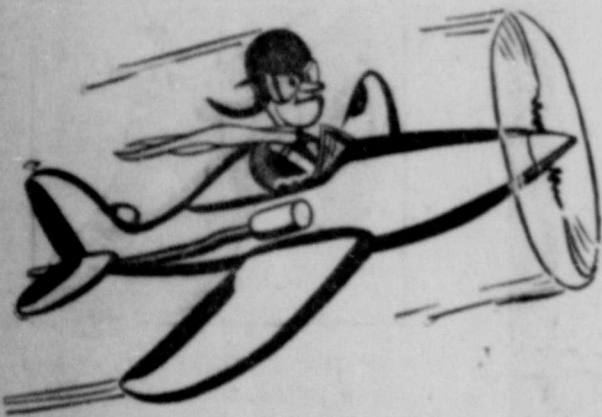
