Information opens its three half-hour daily shows of news and music beamed at Soviet Russia.

In many ways, The Voice still cries in the Russian wilderness. The programs are monitored by the U. S. embassy in Moscow, which reports on how well the signal comes in. But who else in the U. S. S. R. listens, or how much good The Voice does, is an unknown quantity. The station gets no fan mail, because of Russian censorship. The Voice has never been answered directly by Radio Moscow.

Yet this is practically the only outlet the United

Russian people.

While show rave broadcasts to the world from Moscow go out of For the dear God Who leveth he their way to lambast, the United States and all its works, the State Department has not taken to replying in kind. The policy is to deliver a fair and factual presentation of the news to the Russian audience, if any, and so build up a reputation for reliability. There is no effort to slug it out in the old Communist propaganda technique.


