Proposes Formula For Labor Peace

ITHACA, N. Y. (UP)—Failure to recognize human dignity in labor relations is the cause of much of the trouble between labor and management, according to Gen. Robert Wood Johnson, chairman of the board of directors of Johnson & Johnson.

The New Brunswick, N. J., industrialist, writing for the Industrial and Labor Relations Review, published at Cornell University, said future progress depends on both management and labor ac-

cepting four major premises. He listed these as:
1. The root of labor-management trouble is destruction of human dignity; management must restore and develop dignity in both the individual worker and his associations or unions.
2. Management must take the lead in providing constructive, creative leadership.
3. Labor will welcome such leadership and collaborate with it.
4. Restoration of dignity to employment will be profitable in industry, to workers themselves and to the general public.

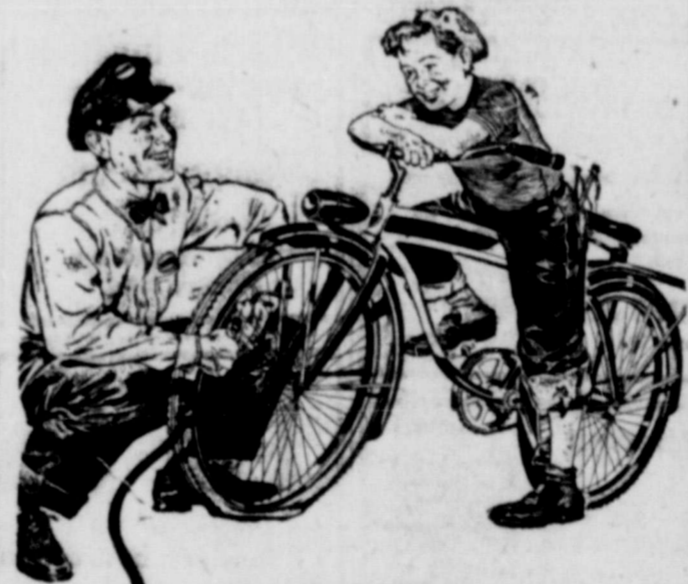
