Christmas Times At Home

It is really too bad that Christmas comes but once a year, for the things it does to people shouldn't be limited to one short season alone. Somehow there's no question at Christmas about sharing with others. It's "Merry Christmas" to everyone. Doors and hearts are open. There is food and drink for all who come.

Speaking of food and drink we'll want to be sure to have plenty of it during the holiday season when all of our friends come around. In our candy dish we could have good home made pecan roll. And here's how its made:

- 1 cup brown sugar
 - 1-8 teaspoon soda
 - 1 cup evaporated milk
 - 1-4 cup corn syrup
 - pecans
- Cook all ingredients together except butter and pecans until the mixture forms a soft ball when dropped in cold water. Remove from fire, add butter and cool. Beat until creamy. Turn out on pastry board or marble slab dusted with powdered sugar. Knead until firm. Shape in a roll about two inches thick. Dip in corn syrup and roll in chopped pecan meats. Keep in a cold place until firm enough to slice.

- 1 lb. butter (scant)
 - 1 lb. sugar (2 cups)
 - 1 lb. pecans
 - 1 lb. raisins (white)
 - 1 teaspoon baking powder
 - 1 lb. flour (4 cups)
 - 6 eggs
 - 4 tablespoons lemon extract
 - Cherries and pineapple
- Cream the butter, add sugar gradually, and beat until smooth. Beat egg yolks until thick and lemon colored. Combine with butter and sugar mixture and beat thoroughly. Dredge the fruit and nuts with the first mixture. Fold

RANGERS PLAY OPENING GAME IN INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENT

The Rangers, only a mile away from being "in the pink" will doff their sweat suits, tonight for the first time this year before local fans breaking the seal on the annual Ranger Invitational Tournament.

Coach Boone Yarbrough's quintet will oppose the Clifton Cowboys in the tap-off game starting at 7:30. Following, Weatherford, and Cisco will take to the court.

The Rangers have broken even in two games played—both in the Clifton tournament. They slipped Temple by a point, 37-36 but dropped a last minute decision to Decatur.

As in football Yarbrough will attempt to make use of the two team system. And if results are comparable to successful gridiron campaign the Rangers are in for a winning year.

Yarbrough hasn't indicated any definite starting line-up as yet but the bulk of the veteran material is sure to get the call for heavy duty. That means seasoned performers like Jimmy Crawley, Junior Arterburn, Ben Hitch, Charley Sullivan, Don Ford, Frankie Ford, and Cled Heathington will be on the firing line.

The potential power of the journey—Wayland College and Lon Morris—won't hit the hardwood until tomorrow evening. Wayland copped top honors last year and is a heavy choice to do a repeat job. While Lon Morris is a perennial power of the basketball court.

Play will continue through tonight, tomorrow and Saturday with the final round being played off Saturday evening. Losers will play consolation rounds during the afternoons.

A quartet of trophies will be presented to the leading teams—one to the winner, the runner-up, a consolation prize and an award to the most sportsmanlike player. Following the completion of play an all-tournament quintet will be selected by the respective coaches.

Barkley spoke at a Town Hall dinner at which he received an award for distinguished public service. Three other administration speakers were present, including Secretary John W. Snyder of the Treasury Department, Air Force Secretary, Stuart Symington and Sen. Joseph C. O'Mahoney of Wyoming. The veteran Kentucky senator said he was "not in a position to predict" whether an excess profits tax will be reauthorized.

Named "Lineman of the Week" in the Southwest once, Tinsley was nominated by Texas sports-writers for lineman of the week in the nation every week during the regular season.

His massive build, 6'4", 225, makes him a standout on the field in size as well as ability. FLOOD OF COUNTERFEIT MONEY SPURS SEARCH

CHICAGO, Dec. 16 (UP) — Extra secret service men were detailed today to search Chicago for printing presses which have been grinding out hundreds of thousands of dollars in counterfeit money. Harry D. Anheier, in charge of the secret service here, said the counterfeit ring, believed to have its headquarters in the Chicago area, is one of the biggest in years. Apparently it hopes to cash in on the Christmas rush, he said, in the belief that merchants do not have time to examine the money handed them. For the last six weeks, Anheier said, counterfeiters have been flooding the nation with fake money. Whether all of it has come from Chicago, or whether two or more rings are operating independently

is not known, authorities said. New York and Chicago have been major dumping grounds for the spurious currency. But the bogus bills also have been passed in the midwest, in the southwest, and in scattered sections from coast to coast. So far, four arrests have been made in Chicago and Illinois. But in each case, the suspect was a "passer," and not one of the key members of the ring. The amount of counterfeit money passed on to the public has been estimated as high as \$1,000,000 (M). Anheier said, however, that the amount actually spotted to date would not exceed \$500,000. Anheier said the counterfeit syndicate sells its products in big lots and apparently knows how to

make connections with "passers" who never have been involved in counterfeiting before. Most of the bogus money spotted so far, he said, has been \$10 and \$20 bills. He said they were "dangerous," the secret service's term for clever reproductions.

Sam Houston Rally Beats Aggies, 53-50

COLLEGE STATION, Dec. 16 (UP) — Sam Houston State erased a Texas Aggie lead late in the final period here last night to win a close 53 to 50 basketball decision.

John Dewitt and Sam Jenkins had paced the Cadets to a 47-42 lead with only five minutes to go, before Sam Houston's Norman Phillips hit with two push shots to bring victory to the visitors. Sam Houston led 28 to 25 at the halftime. Phillips took scoring honors by hitting the net for 19 points, followed closely by the Aggies' Dewitt, who scored 16 points. In the opener last night, the Aggie freshmen cage squad took a 53 to 34 game from the Sam Houston State B team.

Peanut Sales Flowing To Gov Channels

Government purchases dominated the peanut market this week.

according to reports compiled by the Production and Marketing Administration, U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Movement of shelled No. 2 peanuts to the Commodity Credit Corporation amounted to more than 19 million pounds in the southeastern states and about 2 one half million in the south-

west. Purchase of shelled No. 2 and oil stock for the season through November totaled almost 248 million pounds. Farmers' stock peanuts bought under the price support program through November amounted to almost 223 million pounds.

Commercial peanut markets remained dull. Despite light demand shellers held stocks firmly at slightly higher quotations. Occasional lots of No. 1 Spanish sold in the southwest at 16 one half cents a pound.

Peanut oil and meal sold a lit-

tle lower than a week ago in sympathy with other oilseed meals and vegetables oils.

Light marketings of farmers' stock peanuts brought support prices. Pickings is estimated to be 98 per cent complete in Texas and Oklahoma, and 95 per cent in the southeast.

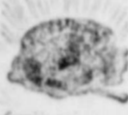

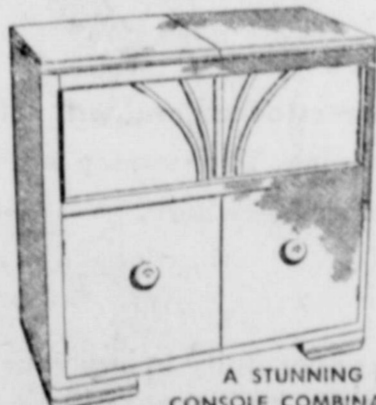
