worth's in charge of arrangements. The body of Flight Officer Mc-Cleskey will arrive in Ranger Monday on the west bound Eagle and will be met by an honor guard of veterans. The deceased was killed in ac-

tion in World War II near San Beneditto, Italy. At the time of his death he was a pilot of a P-47 with 350th Fighter Group of the 12th Air Force. He entered the service of the Army Air Corps on Jan. 29, 1943, and received training at a number of air fields before receiving his wings at Foster Field, Victoria, Texas on May 17, 1944. He had completed more than 30 missions and had been awarded the Air Medal with one cluster and the Purple Heart.

He was born in Eastland, Nov. 5, 1923 but had resided in Ranger most of his life. He was a graduate of Ranger High School and the time he entered the service employed by the Gulf Refinapany at Breckenridge. He

MOVE FOLLOWS RENEWAL OF HOSTILITIES

LONDON, March 12 (UP)-Great Britain is reinforcing her garrison at Aqaba, across the Trans-Jordan border from the southern strip of Palestine occupied by Israeli forces this week, the war office announced

In announcing the lecision trengthen the British detachment at Aqaba, a war office spokesman declined to make public either the present strength of the garrison or the extent of rein-

The move was disclosed a day after the government of Israeli reported that its forces had moved through the Negev and occupied the Elath coastal strip fronting on the Gulf of Aqaba between Trans-Jordan and Israel.

Britain originally sent troops to Aqaba at the turn of the year when Israeli and Egyptian troops were fighting along the border The British garrisoned Aqaba under a treaty with Trans-Jordan calling for mutual aid if either should be attacked.

The British acted after a week of uncertainty and tension which produced at least one clash be tween Israeli and Trans-Jordan forces. Tel Aviv acknowledged the clash yesterday in disclosing that Israeli troops had moved in-
