## Fair Weather Covers Texas

The weather was fair over Texas today, except for a little drizzle around Brownsville this morning. The weather bureau said the high winds yesterday which caused blowing dusting the south plains area had disappeared. They were caused by a low pressure system over Oklahoma.

Lows this morning included 34 at Lubbock, 35 at Salt Flat, 36 at Amarillo and 68 at Brownsville. The high yesterday was 89 at Corpus Christi. Amarillo had the low maximum of 57.

Heavy showers were reported yesterday in East Texas. Rainfall reports for 24 hours included 1.70 inches at Lufkin; 1.64 at Beaumont; 1.68 at Texarkana; 1.95 at Tyler; .86 at Galveston; .72 at Houston and .13 at Amarillo in the Panhandle.

A small twister struck a Red River farming community seven miles north of Texarkana yesterday. A dairy barn on the farm of J. D. Harris was wrecked and several negro houses were damaged but no one was hurt.

The weather outlook is for fair today and tonight in East Texas and partly cloudy and mild Wednesday. For West Texas, fair weather was forecast for today and tonight with increasing cloudiness expected Wednesday. Little change in temperature was foreseen for the entire state.

## Delaney Debunks James Contention

AUSTIN, March 22 (UP)—A 101-year-old man, now recovering from pneumonia in a Austin hospital, really Jesse James?

Frank Dalton, the bewhiskered old gent, says that he is. But Tom Delaney, an 89-year-old ex-cop, says that he isn't. Delaney, who says he knew Jesse in the 1870's, spent ten minutes at Dalton's bedside yesterday and said the old man had failed to pass the "test."

The test was a group of questions which Delaney said only the real Jesse could answer. Delaney said Dalton didn't know the answers, but he didn't have the heart to tell the old man that he wasn't really Jesse.

Dalton could not tell Delaney the name of a horse Jesse James once rode in the Oklahoma territory when he hid out with Belle Starr and the younger brothers.

## Gromyko on Way To UN Meeting

LONDON, March 22 (UP)—Chief Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko has left Moscow for New York to lead the Soviet delegation at the April session of the United Nations General Assembly, radio Moscow said today.

Gromyko headed the Soviet delegation for two years prior to his departure from New York last July to take what he described as his first vacation since 1945. Since then he was promoted from a deputy foreign minister to Chief Deputy. The promotion was announced shortly after Andrei Vishinsky was promoted to foreign minister to replace V. M. Molotov.

Moscow did not include Vishinsky's name in the list of delegates accompanying Gromyko, leading observers to believe that Vishinsky will be absent from this session.

First Washington WASHINGTON, Va. (UP)—This town surveyed and plotted by George Washington on Au. 4, 1749, claims to be the "first Washington of all" but it was not incorporated until Feb. 12, 1894. Twenty-five other cities and towns in the United States are named Washington.
