Near \$200,000

On the heels of a twin disaster that struck Desdemona seen in the area were exhibited. PORT ALLEN, La., March 26. and Rising Star earlier in the day, a third devastating Entries in the swine classes were (UP)—Misssissippi flood fighters twister swept over the Leon Power Plant last night, interrupting service for almost four hours and causing extensive damage to plant property.

The high-powered wind disturbance swept through three power lines serving Eastland and Ranger. From 11:55 to 3:40 A. M. electricity was disrupted in Eastland while power was shut off in Ranger until 4:10 A. M.

Early morning reports from the office of W. B. Pickens, assistant manager of Texas Electric indicate that service in the area has been restored close to normal utilizing pow er from other channels. Pickens said engineers haven't completed their estimate of damage although unofficial sources estimate it at between \$150,000 and \$200,000.

The freak path of the storm crumbled a 60-foot steel tower but left an adjacent 80 foot tower-16 feet awayundamaged. The Leon Plant village, an employe community near the plant was spared from the path of the de-
